### 4th Grade Math: No test this week.

This chapter is over Multiplication: 2-Digit Multipliers. We will be busy multiplying in this chapter and will even multiply money. We have worked with the multiplication-addition principle and are using a lot of mental math in this chapter.

### 5th Grade Math: Test on Monday, April 15th.

Tuesday we will begin multiplying a whole number by a fraction and we will learn how to find a fraction of a whole number. We will also be solving fraction word problems.

### 6th Grade Math: Test on Monday, April 15th.

We will briefly go over problems involving volume. Students will learn how to find the volume of various shapes and will discuss when we may use volume formulas in every day life. We will then begin discussing ratios, proportions, and percents. We will determine unit rate, and use ratios to represent real-life situations and solve problems.

### 7th & 8th Grade Math: Test on Monday, April 15th.

On Tuesday we will begin talking about probability and statistics. We will look at many different types of tables with data. We will find mean, median and mode. We will study histograms, pie charts, stem-and-leaf diagrams, construct scatter-plots and box-and-whisker diagrams. We will also look at bar graphs and line graphs to answer questions associated with the graphs. We will discuss the fundamental principles of counting and will work with permutations and combinations.
