**THE HANCOCK COUNTY FUND OF THE MAINE COMMUNITY FOUNDATION
AWARDS \$5,000 GRANT TO FAMILIES FIRST COMMUNITY CENTER FOR
LIFE SKILLS AND MENTORING PROGRAMMING**

ELLSWORTH - Families First Community Center has received a \$5,000 grant from the Hancock County Fund of the Maine Community Foundation to design and implement life skills programming and a mentoring program.

“This generous grant will ensure that the Families First Community Center can begin their Life Skills classes and begin training volunteer mentors, called VIFS (Volunteers in Family Service), for those in

need in the County and also those residing in their soon-to-come Home for homeless families with minor children, which will be in Ellsworth,” said Dawn Carter Coffin, president of the board of directors.

“The number one cause of homelessness in Hancock County is generational poverty, which affects multiple generations. Parents need help with life skills so they can be self-sufficient. The National Council to End Homelessness highly recommends Homes with similar philosophies to transitional homes that teach life skills and offer referrals, education, medical, safety planning, case management and mentors.”

With this grant, Families First Community Center now will be able to begin services for those in need even before the Home is renovated and ready for occupancy. A Case Manager is also about to be hired.

The nonprofit Families First Community Center was founded in 2015 with a mission to **break the cycle of homelessness** before it is passed down to the next generation. It equips families with minor children with the housing and skills they need to gain self-sufficiency. Residents will be required to work 40 hours per week towards this goal. The Home opening is planned for late 2017.
