MMUNITY NEWS & EVENTS

Again, this year, the Community Council for the Arts, under the administration of Sandy Landis, Executive Director, has secured a charitable grant from the North Carolina Arts Council, a Stage

agency. This Arts in Education grant is funding an artist in residence for the purpose of providing artistic enrichment programming for students. We are pleased to welcome back, for a third year, GLENIS REDMOND, Poet-in-Residence. Glenis will be working with students at Rochelle Middle School this spring (delayed schedule from January due to inclement weather). Rochelle Middle School is an A+ School, centered around the arts. Glenis Redmond, a professional poet from Greenville, South Carolina, will share her artistic expertise, encouraging students to confidently reflect inwardly, and to express themselves outwardly through the formation of words. A second residency is scheduled for two weeks with the Duplin County School System. This residency will feature this year's CCA National Exhibition Juror, Tunde Afolayan Famous, in an identity mask making workshop. (See page 2 for more information on Tunde.) The residency has been arranged through the coordination of the CCA with the Duplin Co. Schools as a part of the Regional Arts Partners grant held by the CCA. This grant allows for the out reach from the CCA to Duplin Co. to provide assistance with the Grassroots Program Grant scheduling, appropriate expenditures and writing/reporting of the grant. This is the 10th year that this partnership exists between the two organizations. The grants are provided through the NC Arts Council, a State Agency.

On Saturday, February 3, September Kreuger, a Wilmington, North Carolina artist, will work with a small group of selected students from Rochelle Middle School on a special project which will be revealed at a later date. September is known to us as the instructor for the mosaics located at the Kinston Music Park: Celebrating Our African American Music Heritage. Stay tuned for the results of this Saturday workshop. Want to explore your artistic abilities and have a night out with your friends? Consider a Spirited Palette class! No special skills are needed, just a desire to share a fun evening creating art. **Participants enter at Blount Street entrance.** All supplies provided and light snacks; participants should bring beverage of choice. This activity is perfect for church groups, sororities, a couple's date night, or for a girls' night out. We supply a canvas, set of brushes, paint, cups/napkins, and a light snack. Students will be shown step-by-step instructions on how to paint a specially-themed picture. When the night is over, you will go home with a completed painting! Remember to wear old clothes, apron or a smock, and be prepared to have a great time! Class size is limited to 15 and registration is required in advance.

Sign up today for "Painting in the Studio" intermediate class with gifted artist Ed Macomber. This six-week class will involve demonstration, guidance, and critique to reward each artist with his/her favorite subjects or interests. During this class students will be painting from life – objects students bring and stage for creating their own work of art. This will involve NO copying or cut out art, but the "set" can be shared by no more than two artists. This will require the usual materials, but also a "set" for each one's subject – a piece of 2'x2' foam sheet, a small cardboard box, some type of "base" to hold the item(s), and some non-descript fabric of each artist's choosing. Use of fabric with too complicated a pattern is not recommended. Use up to four objects that will fit on the 2'x2' surface. (Examples: a tea set, a group of dolls, stuffed animals, or any found object that speaks of a person's "past time" object (ex. fishing reels, lures, and a "catch basket")). BEGINNING DRAWING CLASS (THE NEXT STEP) Tuesdays (6 weeks) New Class Starts February 20, 2018

New Class Starts February 20, 2018 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Cost: \$100, Member/ \$110, Non-Member Ages & Skills: All ages & Beginners Instructor: *Ed Macomber*

This is a continuation of the basic drawing skills class which began on January 8, 2018. This class will NOT cover what was covered in the first series.

Week 1. Moving the sketch to a finished drawing. We will work with simply still life drawing (flowers, table settings, numerous objects) and learn to create finished works of art in charcoal and graphite.

Week 2. Completion of week 1's subject and critique.

Week 3, How to draw animals. Using the basic forms learned in the first series, we will learn how to create finished animal drawings, that begin with the sketch, and refine that into a finished portrait. We will study many species, but will concentrate on the dog, and cat. This will also be charcoal and/or graphite.

Week 4. Completion of week 2's subject and critique.

Week 5. Drawing the human head and figure. Using both photographic images, and also some members of the class, we will explore simple proportions, defining, and likeness secrets to end in a finished work by end of week 6.

Week 6. The "full monty" of both perspective, combined with the use of human characters in the drawing will challenge the artist to finish a street scene in this final drawing class. This is both review, Q&A, plus mounting techniques.

Materials for the class:

- Newspaper sketch pad (18" x 24") Newspaper pads are much cheaper than other types and more useable for learning to draw. We'll use a lot of paper. Please no pad smaller.
- Drawing pencils #2B, 4B, 6B only, one each if possible.
- Small artist pen such as Pigma Micron, Faber Castell, or Faber –Castell. These are black permanent drawing pens, NOT permanent markers. Sizes # 0.5 or 0.8 mm. At most internet art supply or Hobby Lobby.
- Kneaded eraser (gray moldable soft eraser).
- Drawing shield. Staples or art stores. Small metal drawing aid.
- Book: "Perspective" by William F. Powell. Paperback from Amazon is less than \$5. Including S&H and there are plenty of available ones at that price.
- Charcoal Sticks or pencils, soft or medium, NO hard sticks or pencils.
- Straight edge, such as a 15" ruler, or 24" no longer.
