



He received his formal training in art at the prestigious 'Yaba Tech' (Lagos-Nigeria) and attended graduate school at the University of Missouri in Columbia. He has taught art courses at Yaba Tech, National Louis University, and Elizabeth City State University. In 2006, Tunde became a full-time studio artist, maintaining his practice in Raleigh, North Carolina. He is the recipient of numerous artist residencies across the United States. 


