



Grassroots Program Sub-grants 2019 — The following are recipients of the Grassroots Arts Subgrant Program sponsored by the North Carolina Arts Council, a State agency. The Grassroots Program grant annually places dollars in each of North Carolina's counties for qualified arts programs. This is done through the North Carolina Legislature. Monies are distributed to the counties through a Designated or Provisional County Partner with the North Carolina Arts Council.

Since the grant program's inception, Lenoir County's designated partner is the Community Council for the Arts. Dollars allotted are based on the respective County's census. If the population is more than 50,000, the designated partner must sub-grant 50% of the dollars received to non-profit arts organizations or non-profit organizations with an arts program. The partner also needs to match the multicultural percentage of the county with the same or more program multicultural artists. The amount of Subgrants distributed this year in Lenoir County is \$13,600. This amount is 70% of the total grant although the CCA can use 50% for programming from the organization we choose to provide increased support locally.
