The Pupil Premium funding was used to provide additional educational support to improve the progress and raise then standard of achievement for all those children on the Pupil Premium Register in 2016/17. It was used to narrow and close the gap between the achievement of these pupils and their peers. As well as providing educational support, the funding was used to address the emotional ad social well-being of these children.

The impact of Pupil Premium Funding:

With the opportunity to consolidate learning, the % of pupils making expected age related progress increased, especially in Maths and English and those pupils who were below the nationally expected average were able to make better than average progress allowing them to close the gaps in their learning.

Pastoral support and enrichment activities improved the children's confidence and self-esteem which impacted on their learning and attainment. Children developed the resilience to cope with the events in their lives and were more ready to learn and to access the curriculum.

Attendance improved and children came into school with a more positive attitude. There was a significant decrease in incidents of bad behaviour.
