He was shot after running from a car that had been stopped by the police. As a youth of Greenwood, Pastor Harris told us how to avoid these encounters, in a sermon, just two weeks before Antwon's death.

Pastor Harris preached a sermon from Ephesians 6:1-2, 4. He reminded us that the Home is the University of Life,

where everything is learned. Your parents have already taught you right from wrong and how to respect others. If you heed their words and watch the company you keep, you will be a step ahead if your car is stopped by the police. However, if you are stopped or pulled over, The National Black Police Association recommends that you: \*Be respectful. Answer questions - yes sir, and no sir. \*Open your car window. Turn on your

dome light so the police can see inside your car. \*Get your papers out before the police come to the car. This includes license, insurance and registration. \*Keep your hands in plain view. \*Do not make sudden moves. \*Do not run, resist, or protes-t too strongly.

## SS—Spring Quarter—Acknowledging God By Mary Ferguson

These lessons examine how Bible scriptures give testimony to God and most importantly, give instruction on how Christians should acknowledge God in our daily lives. Thus, building on individual faith, gives one the ability to worship God in truth and in spirit.

Unit one—Follow In My Ways. This unit highlights the personal commitment of Abraham to God and his true obedience to God's command. I believe when Abraham, gave his son Isaac as a burned offering, not knowing if God would save his son, was an expression of his faith and trust in God. Abraham's willingness to sacrifice Isaac, was also an act of following the will of God and to know for himself who God really is. God will always be with us and guide our path into righteous living.
