The 2018 Annual Conference By Bonnie S. Holmes

The Annual Conference of the First Episcopal District, with Bishop Henry M. Williamson, Sr. presiding, was held July 22-25, 2018, at Mt. Olive CME Church.

The Conference began with Holy Communion Service and a powerful message from St. John 12:1-31. On Monday and Tuesday we had Mediation sermons. Monday Rev. Willie Boyd, Pastor of Martin Memorial Temple, spoke from the book of Jeremiah 18:1-4, "God Uses Broken Things." He highlighted that God can get more out of us and we can see who God really is when we are broken. Tuesday, Rev. Charlton Johnson, Pastor of Trinity CME, spoke from the book of Philippians 1:1-4, "Hold On To Your Joy." Joy is that inner peace that only God can give. We must choose to trust



God and the promise of peace He gives.

Other presenters were Rev. Dr. Phillip Nelson who gave us 5 principles on prayer—privilege, purpose, petition, praise and power. With these principles we align our lives with God's will. The Youth and Young Adults presented, "A Moment in the History of the CME Church," each day of the Conference. They highlighted the following Bishops: Chester Kirkendoll, Sr., B. Julian Smith, Theresa J. Norton, Joseph A. Johnson and William H. Graves.

The Lay Luncheon speaker was Mr. Otis Sanford, Public Affairs Commentator. His focus was on Leadership and Civic En-

gagement. He emphasized that we must us have courage like
Freddrick Douglass, Dr.
Martin L. King and others. We are to demand a seat at the table.

"Inferior Negroes have no rights." He stated that the Supreme Court is not the highest court, but our omnipotent, omniscient and omnipresent God is judge of the highest court. Hebrews 4:16 reminds us to tap into our God given strengths.

The Conference closed with Greenwood being assigned a new Pastor, Rev. Omar L. Dykes. We thank God for our Pastor and pray that God will bless the work He has assigned his hands, by a hundred fold, here at Greenwood.
