

men group. Become a member when you choose to pay your first \$2 to a member of your group who scores a "2" on a hole. Report new memberships to the Tournament chair at the end of play.

Hole-in-One (HIO) members pay \$2 to the HIO "bank". The \$2 is paid to the HIO Chair. Anytime a member gets an HIO on a Wednesday Play Day or Tournament they *win* the money in the "bank". Generally the winner pays for drinks for the DWGC golfers that day. The "bank" is replenished after each HIO.

To be eligible for PWGA Team Play and Major Tournaments a member must have a handicap index of or less.

Only those members who have joined the Davis Worn Golf Club **at least sixty (60) days** prior to the first day of the month in which a major tournament is held and have an official PWGA index will be eligible to compete in the tournaments.

MAJOR TOURNAMENTS

Club Championship, Ace of the Year, and the Han Tournaments will have assigned tee times. Those not in the tournaments will tee off following the tournament players. The Pro Shop will have the tee times. Post your tournament score with a **(T)**.

ACE OF THE YEAR

Low Gross/Low Net

Ace of the Month is determined by the lowest gross & scores for the month (November through October). At the month will then play to determine Ace of the Year

PRO POINTS AND PUTTS

Pro Points are awarded for low net scores. The person with the most Pro Points is the winner for the year. The low are determined by the Putting Points method.

Tuesday afternoon. Check in 30 minutes before play on Wednesday.

If you are unable to play, please notify the tournament chair or pro shop as soon as possible.

Beat the Pro: Bet \$1 to \$10 at the Pro Shop. If you beat the pro, your account is credited with double your bet. If you don't beat the pro, your bet goes into your account.

Blind Nine: Tournament Chair or Pro Shop draws nine holes after the round. For game score, total these nine holes and deduct half of your handicap.

Match Play: Winner takes all. For example, "Sweeps" is \$3, so winner receives \$6.

Mystery Ball: One best ball and one mystery ball on each hole. Assign each player with a mark such as a diamond, a heart, a spade, or a club. Make up scorecard with pops according to handicaps. After you complete a hole, proceed to the next tee box. You will find a card that will tell you who was the mystery hole player on the past hole. You must use the mystery hole person's score for the mystery ball and may choose to use it for the best ball also. Two jokers on the course are wild.

2. Play without delay. Keep up with the group ahead, being careful not to play until they are out of range. Have your club ready. There is no penalty in stroke play for playing out of turn from the teeing ground or elsewhere. To speed up play, the player reaching the tee box first should tee off. When two balls are hit approximately the same distance, but are on opposite sides of the fairway, the player who reaches the ball first should hit first, as long as she is not endangering another player and is not in danger of being hit herself.
3. Players searching for a ball should signal players behind to pass as soon as it is determined that the ball will not be easily found. (They should not wait five minutes before doing so.)
4. A slow play penalty will be assessed to each member of the offending group, if there are four or more complaints voiced to the Tournament Chair, and if the time elapsed has exceeded four hours, fifteen minutes from tee-off time.
5. Leave from the rear of the green and score on the next tee.

WINTER RULES

Days to be announced by Tournament Chair and/or Pro Shop.

A ball may be lifted, cleaned, and placed within one (1) club length through the green, no closer to the hole. For any other areas, other rules may apply. Any ball lifted for cleaning must first be marked. A free lift may be taken from standing water and abnormal course conditions (i.e., deep tire tracks).

The drainage swales to the left of holes #6, #7, #8, #9, #10, #12, #14, and behind hole #11, are permanent drainage swales. These extend from the point where the slope begins to the out-of-bounds. Any ball in these areas may be lifted, cleaned, and dropped with a one (1) club length out of the swale and no nearer the hole. The same rule applies if the swale is wet or dry.

CHANGE IN LOCAL RULE: There is **no longer free relief** from yardage marker bushes/shrubs. They will be treated like all other obstructions on the course. If your ball is unplayable you may deem it unplayable and take relief per Rule 28. OB fences, poles, stakes are deemed fixed, no relief.

Hole # Local Rule:

1. Fence on left is OUT OF BOUNDS (Rule 27).
2. Power poles on left mark OUT OF BOUNDS.
3. Power poles on left are OUT OF BOUNDS. Later hazard on right (Rule 26).
4. Power poles and green fence on left denote OUT OF BOUNDS. Green fence on left or beyond green – UNPLAYABLE LIE (Rule 28).
5. Green fence on left marks OUT OF BOUNDS. Lateral water hazard on right (Rule 26).
6. Black fence on left is OUT OF BOUNDS. Lateral

10. White stakes on left by parking lot – OUT OF BOUNDS. Driving Range on right – OUT OF BOUNDS – if questionable, hit a provisional ball. Water back of green. Use all Rule 26 options with drop zone as an additional option.
11. Black fence behind green – OUT OF BOUNDS. Water hazard in front of tee box (yellow stakes) and lateral hazard (red stakes) to the right of the tee box.
12. Black fence on left – OUT OF BOUNDS. Lateral water hazard on right. Fence protruding into fairway on left is immovable obstruction if it interferes with your stance or swing. Rule 24
13. Black fence on left and in back of green – OUT OF BOUNDS.
14. Fence on left – OUT OF BOUNDS.
15. Chain link fence on left – OUT OF BOUNDS.
16. Lateral water hazard on right and behind green: Use all Rule 26 options with drop zone as an additional option
17. Chain link fence on left – OUT OF BOUNDS. Lateral water hazard on right. Driving Range on right – OUT OF BOUNDS. Brush piles on right – Ground under repair. Rule 25 1b,c.

Jane has a 17 handicap, so she can take a maximum of 7 on any hole. 13 minus 7 is 6, so when Jane posts, she will subtract 6 strokes from her total score, assuming she did not get more than a 7 on any other hole.

3. To prevent lost balls, help watch your teammate competitors' shots.
4. Determine club selection while others are play anticipation of your next shot.
5. Avoid excessive practice swings.
6. When sharing a power cart, the player not hitting should walk to her ball and be ready to hit. Talk to the player with you in anticipation of the shot.
7. Except in match play, use continuous putting as possible. Leave the green as soon as possible.
8. Study your putt before it is your turn, and putt delay.
9. Leave green and move to the next tee as soon as possible. Enter your score at the next tee.
10. If you are falling behind, discuss the situation with your group and take remedial action to catch up to the following group through.
