Where do rivers begin? Why were railroads usually built on ridges? An Environmental Scientist from Gwinnett's Water Resources Dept. will lead kids through fun, hands-on activities that help them connect local storm drains to the Chattahoochee River. Then we'll check out who lives in a nearby stream, followed with an important kid-conducted project that will encourage the whole community to be good stream stewards! *Please have your child wear close-toed shoes that can get muddy, and bring a towel or even dry clothes to change into (just in case!) Water quality of our local stream will be monitored ahead of time for safety.*
