# August 19, 2018 - Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

## Focusing the Gospel John 6:51-58

"Two dimensions of Jewish worship provide the context of today's gospel, the fourth part of the bread of life discourse in John 6.

In Jewish thought, blood was considered to be life (Deut 12:23): as blood drained away from a living being so did life itself. The Jews, therefore, considered blood sacred, as belonging to God alone (Leviticus 17:10-14 includes a clear prohibition against consuming any form of blood). In animal sacrifices, blood was ritually drained from the carcass as belonging to God, the author of life. With this as a background, then, John's theology of the Eucharist includes Jesus' exhortation to drink his blood, that is, to share in his life. To "feast" on Jesus is to feast on the very life of God: to consume the bread of the Eucharist is to assimilate Jesus' life-giving presence in the very fiber of our being.

The graphic imagery that likely turned off so many of Jesus' own followers can be a turnoff even today. Jesus doesn't couch his words by claiming he speaks metaphorically. He doubles down on the "flesh and blood" language as he himself is the incarnation of the Word. When we consume the Eucharist, the Body and Blood, we consume Jesus himself."

#### Enfocando el Evangelio - Juan 6: 51-58

"Dos dimensiones del culto judío proporcionan el contexto del evangelio de hoy, la cuarta parte del discurso pan de vida en Juan 6.

En el pensamiento judío, la sangre se consideraba vida (Deut 12:23): a medida que la sangre se drenaba de un ser viviente, también lo hacía la vida misma. Los judíos, por lo tanto, consideraron la sangre como sagrada, como pertenecer únicamente a Dios (Levítico 17: 10-14 incluye una clara prohibición de consumir cualquier forma de sangre). En los sacrificios de animales, la sangre fue drenada ritualmente del cadáver como perteneciente a Dios, el autor de la vida. Con esto como un trasfondo, entonces, la teología de la Eucaristía de Juan incluye la exhortación de Jesús para beber su sangre, es decir, para compartir en su vida. Para "festejar" a Jesús es deleitarse con la vida misma de Dios: consumir el pan de la Eucaristía es asimilar la presencia vivificante de Jesús en la misma fibra de nuestro ser.

Las imágenes gráficas que probablemente apagaron a tantos de los seguidores de Jesús pueden desvanecerse incluso hoy en día. Jesús no expresa sus palabras al decir que habla metafóricamente. Él dobla en el lenguaje de "carne y sangre" ya que él mismo es la encarnación de la Palabra. Cuando consumimos la Eucaristía, el Cuerpo y la Sangre, consumimos a Jesús mismo ".
