Focusing the Gospel

Key words and phrases: This is my chosen Son; listen to him.

To the point: For the second time in the Gospel of Luke the voice of God claims Jesus as God's son. The first moment was at his baptism when "the holy Spirit descended upon him in, bodily form" (Luke 3:22; NABRE). At that time the voice of God proclaimed, 'You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (NABRE). At the Jordan River the voice from heaven speaks directly to Jesus, but on the mountain where Jesus goes to pray with his closest companions the voice addresses those around Jesus—Peter, James, and John—telling them, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." These words are addressed to us when we encounter our Lord in the Word and the Eucharist, "Behold, here is Jesus the chosen one, listen to him." *Living Liturgy 2019, page 81*

You are reminded of the Church's laws for fast and abstinence during Lent, which began on Ash Wednesday, March 6, 2019. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fasting. Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are permitted one full meal and two lesser meals per day (which together should not equal one full meal), with no eating between meals.

Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Catholics who are 14 years or older should abstain from meat entirely. Soups and gravies made from meat are permitted.
