The tariffs are affecting costs of products. Several of our suppliers have announced that they will be increasing prices in some fashion. It may be a combination of line item surcharges and/ or a simple price increase. Both have been mentioned as possibilities. Jeld-Wen had already announced a price increase several months ago but delayed it until September 1 so a 6% increase from Jeld-Wen is in effect immediately. ODL has announced a surcharge on certain line items beginning September 16 and a 4.5% price increase taking effect in November. LJ Smith Stair Systems will have a 25% price increase in September on iron balusters that are coming from China. Woodgrain also has an increase but it varies from product to product as far as the amount. As you can see we are in the middle of a dilemma that we

cannot do anything about and have no idea what the eventual result will be. The idea of addressing fair trade is way past due and we applaud the effort to fix it but it will not be easy. Let us just hope it does not kill the economy. Please be very careful covering your tracks when quoting. Prices could change with little or even no notice in some cases.

Other industry news includes the announced sale of Silverline vinyl windows by Andersen Windows. A holding company that owns both Atrium and PlyGem have announced the purchase of Silverline from Andersen. It will be interesting to see the industry ramifications of that transaction in the future.

On a high note, ABP has taken on a promotional fiberglass entry door product that is more than competitive. There are three designs, three colors and one size and they are prefinished and ready to install making this a turnkey product line.
