BATTLE OF THE BEST <u>CHAMPIONSHIPS</u>



How would you like to represent the ISST at a Battle of the Best Championship amongst neighboring tours? Chris Tuskowski and I have been working on putting this event together. We have a few tours on board so far and hope to add some more. Each tour is eligible to send two teams in handicap, two in Scratch Girls and two in Scratch Boys. Each team will consist of five bowlers.

How does one make this prestigious team you ask? Well, it's really simple. The tour already has a point system in place, giving you points for attendance, every 200 games bowled and ranking in each event. Top 10 bowlers in each division attending a minimum of 4 events will be offered a spot to compete on the team. If they turn down the opportunity, it will go down the line until we have filled the spots. This event will consist of 4/5 person team games and 8 baker games. There will also be a doubles and singles event using the first 4 team game scores. Event will be on a sport pattern. Brackets will also be available as well as a Junior Gold Qualifier for 2017.

Entry fee per person would be as follows: \$18 lineage, \$54 Scholarships & \$3 expenses/awards = \$75. Dress code would be the same as the ISST with the exception that we would allow the girls to wear shorts/skorts/skirts that are fingertip length appropriate. We ask that each tour have shirts made up for their teams. Team picks will be announced at the final event in March. If you bowl in multiple tours and qualify for multiple teams, it is your responsibility to select the tour that you choose to represent.

The first event will be hosted by the Illinois State Scholarship Tour. There will also be programs available that feature information about each tour with their stats and biographies of their bowlers. Any further updates will be announced on our website www.isyl.org and at the tour stops.

Trophies will be given to each Trophies will be given to each host tour from which the championship team qualified from and each member of the team will be awarded medals. Gold for 1st, Silver for 2nd and Bronze for 3rd.

I hope that everyone accepts the challenge to be the Best of the Best!


