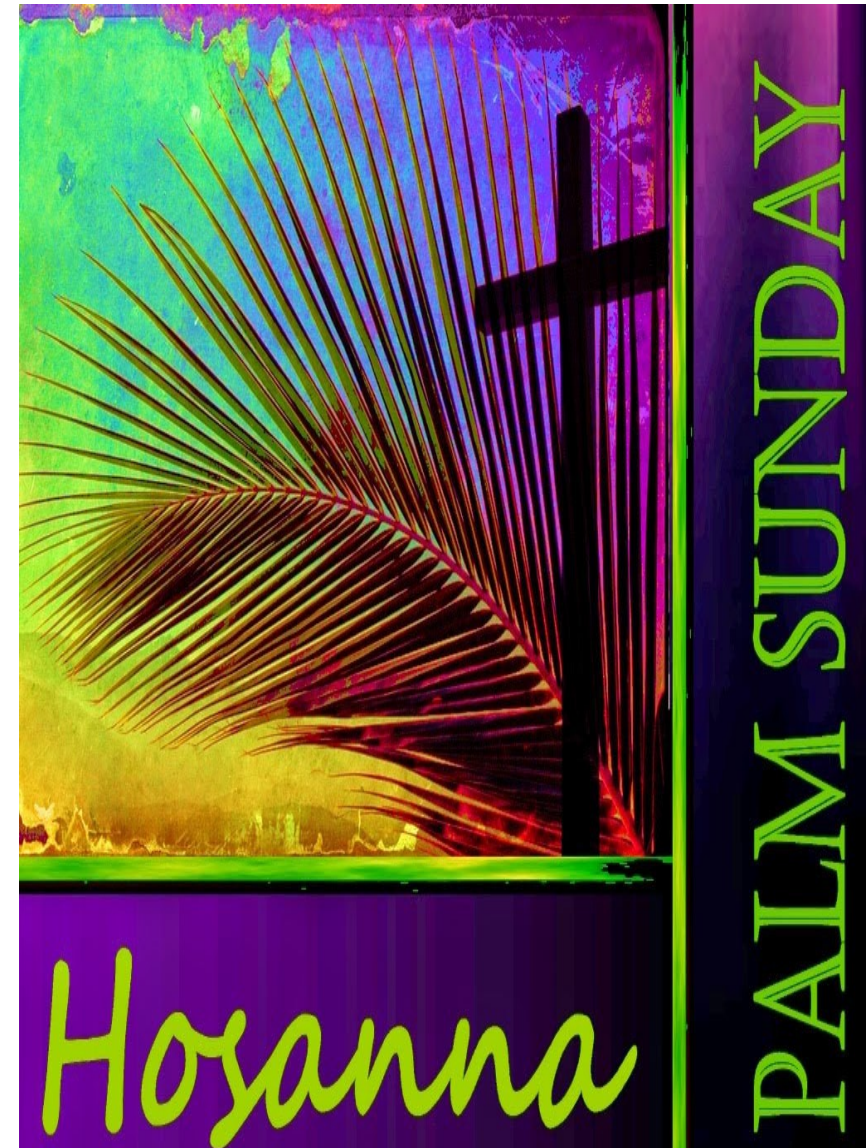

“Since the beginning of the Christian faith, we have had to shelter in place and avoid public gathers for fear of persecution. Our current context of Covid 19 suggest we borrow from the saints who came before us. Here a few ways to continue to worship and be a commu-
 nity:

1. Uplifting conversations by phone, video or text
2. Singing worshipful songs, alone, with a soundtrack or with others on the phone or video
3. Consider a Bible Devotion
4. Focus conversations on what we have while acknowledging the real possibilities. Address concerns and reduce fear and anxiety.
5. Check in on one another as we would if we were gathering for Worship.
6. Engage in online worship: sing, shout Amen, pray out loud even if you are alone in your quiet space.

Remember: *This is the day the Lord has made; We will rejoice and be glad in it.* - Psalm 118:24 (NKJV)

...When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said: “Drink from this, all of you, this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.
