The Role of a Fire Chaplain

A Fire Chaplain is someone who helps firefighters and their families in times of need or crisis and someone who supports and encourages spiritual health and wellness in the fire service. Some duties may include:

- Memorial Services
- Care for injured or sick personnel and families
- Involvement with CISM teams/training
- Serve as liaison to local clergy
- Invocations/prayers at ceremonies or events
- Teaching fire service personnel in areas of spiritual and emotional wellness
- Be a confidential listening ear to personnel and families
- Be a resource to help personnel to connect to EAPs, counselling, or other wellness initiatives
