Phase II of the original HOC expansion plan in 2007 included the addition of a third house. We believe the time is right to make that a reality. We are excited to announce that we have the plans and are launching our targeted fund raising campaign to expand the very special ministry that is HOC. The new house will sit on the lot between the two existing houses as a connection and expansion of the house built in 2007...greatly enhancing our ability to serve the needs of our guests!

The new facility will allow us to provide more access for people with limited mobility, give us the ability to support families with younger children, and accommodate longer term medical stays. Mayo clinic is significantly expanding their operations and as a result we will need to be able to provide more rooms, so that we can limit the times when we have to turn people away.

In short, this new addition will allow us to not only continue, but to do even more to minister to the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of our guests.

Why Do We Need A New House?



Everyone who has been associated with the HOC Ministry over the years is proud and blessed to have been able to provide free ministry and housing to people who are at the Mayo Clinic during what is often one of the most stressful times in their life. Thanks to the amazing and ongoing support of many people over the past 30+ years, HOC has touched the lives, hearts and spirits of thousands as they experience serious medical challenges. During this time, we have been able to service the needs of many, but we

have also had to turn some away because of our limitations. Those limitations will be even more challenging given the significant expansion of Mayo Clinic and the services they offer.

Limitation #1: We only have two rooms that can be accessed without having to navigate stairs. This is a major problem for the many people who come to Mayo with physical limitations that make stairs difficult or even impossible to navigate. The new house will solve that problem by providing elevator access to multiple floors in the new house and via the integrated connection to the 2007 house.



Limitation #2: The communal nature of the HOC facilities is a key component of the ministry. However, that also makes it challenging to support families with young chil-

dren. The new house addresses that by providing connected rooms on the "garden level" which can be opened into a suite to accommodate these families while still protecting the pri-



into a suite to accommodate these families while still protecting the privacy of other guests and the communal environment.

Limitation #3: Limited space also creates challenges when we are working to serve people who are facing extended stays, which is a growing component of Mayo's service model. In the past, we have flexed as much as possible to support extended stay needs. With the Mayo Clinic expansion and extended services, we know we will be even more challenged to sup-

port guests needing extended stays. The design of the new house gives us the flexibility to more easily accommodate the needs of guests who require extended stays.

How Can You Help?

The cost to build and fund initial operational setup will be about \$1.7M. This includes the cost for connecting and integrating the two houses as a single unit, the elevator to extend wheelchair and disability access, as well as remodeling and upgrades for common shared space across the two integrated houses.
