Using Cards to Glorify God!!!



In August 2008, an Elder of our church, Dave Leatherwood, brought the Card Ministry back from a church in Missouri and asked me if I would oversee it. In the beginning, Ruth Stoves, Debra Jansen, and my wife were handmaking all of the cards. When that got to be too much, we acquired a computer card program and made the cards. We started out with about 10 people and have slowly moved up to around 16. At first, we were just writing encouragement to those in the church that were identified to us and family members and friends. Visitors to the congregation also received a card. We added cards for the missionaries we were supporting.



Then Phillip and Tarese went to Hands of Compassion and asked if we could write cards for the people staying at your houses. Later on, our minister, Jeff, went down to the Douglas County Youth Corrections (DCYC) and asked if we could supply cards there. I was told that the youth exchanged the cards with one another, and as the guards looked on, they asked

where their cards were – so the next time we added cards for the guards. After that the church adopted Betz School and we added the staff to our writing. Then Randy Schow, Executive Director of Mountain States Children's Home in Colorado, brought by some change cans for us to fill up for Christmas. We didn't feel it was right to fill the cans without offering encouragement to them (the children and house parents) – so we added them to the list.

I want to say this. There was one point that, as we kept adding more cards, I doubted that we would be able to get the writers. It was then that I knew it wasn't my problem – it was God's. This was His ministry, not mine. If He wanted these cards written, He would supply the writers. I needed faith instead of doubt. Prayers were lifted up and all of a sudden people started coming up to me saying they couldn't come on Tuesday night, but they wanted to write and suddenly there were plenty of writers.

It is kind of funny. We think we are lifting people up, but the truth is we are encouraged and lifted up more by what we are doing; and when we get a card back from someone we wrote to, the feeling is something I don't know how to describe. Andy Payson
