Administration

Wanted – park members who are willing to commit time and energy to making the park a vibrant and positive environment for all. Helpful qualities include being open minded, volunteer oriented and an understanding of and commitment to follow the Bylaws and Rules & Regulations of the park. Candidates must have been a member for at least one year; be in good standing (no outstanding violations or fines); and not have been a park employee in the past year.

The Board of Directors consists of 9 members. Directors are elected for 3 year terms and may serve two consecutive terms plus any years of appointment. They may run for re-election after 1 year absence from the board.

Members who are considering running for the board of directors are encouraged to attend monthly open board meetings and workshops so they can better understand board responsibilities and time commitments. Being on the board of directors is a commitment of both time and energy but if you are interested in helping shape direction for the park, it is a worthwhile experience.

ByLaws

The proposal process is how members can make changes to the Bylaws and Rules & Regulations. The Board of Directors has the authority to make changes to Rules during open board meetings but they must also follow the proposal process to enact changes to Bylaws. Bylaws can be added to, amended or repealed by 2/3rd majority of all votes cast in the annual election.

The process for submitting proposals is outlined in the Bylaws and in Administrative Policy and must be followed in order to have proposals considered. The office has the necessary proposal forms or you can download them from the website. You will need 2 copies of the form, one for the proposal change and one for the required 30 member signatures. Check with the office staff if you have questions BEFORE the deadline.

Written proposals must be submitted to the office by May 31st No member may submit more than four proposals to be voted on during the election process Proposals must include a 'Reason(s) for' If the proposal requires spending of park (corporate) funds, a cost estimate must be attached The proposal must be signed by the submitting member Proposals require signatures of 30 members in good standing before being sent to the membership for a vote Approved proposals take effect at 12:01am January 1st of the year following being approved

unless an effective date & time is specified in the proposal Proposals that have been vot-

ed on and defeated by the membership within the past 3 years cannot be resubmitted until the 4th year.

When mailing your checks or setting up auto pay please remember to put your site number in the memo. If you're paying on a contract please specify it's for a contract.

Guests (Rule reminder)

Any member loaning his/her key card to a "guest" for use in the member's absence will fill out and sign a form that is available in the office. Also, members may give guests a letter of approval for use of their campsite in the member's absence. The letter must indicate guest's name, address, and phone number, vehicle license number, the date of arrival and the date of departure from the Park. The letter must also state, "I accept full responsibility for the above guest including liability for any damage to the Club grounds or facilities that may occur". Signature must be that of the designated owner and signify that the guest is in possession of a key card. These letters are to be renewed annually prior to May 15. One copy is to be put in the member's file, one copy to be retained by the guest at all times when they are in the Park. These guests <u>MUST</u> register at the office or the Guest Register at the front gate <u>EVERY TIME</u> they use the facilities and every time after a twentyfour (24) hour or more absence from the Park. These Park uses will be added to the member's use in regard to the 270-day rule.
