### Ship 876 Sea Scouts to compete in International William I Koch Cup in Galveston, July 8-13, 2018

Two teams from Sea Scout Ship 876 "The Cricket", charted by OYC, have qualified from the Northeast Region to compete in the International William I Koch Cup in Galveston, July 8-13, 2018. They are two of only six teams going from the region, one of four regions in the country, after placing in the Northeast Region North Qualifier last July at the University of Connecticut. It is unprecedented for two teams from the same ship to qualify! Our Ship 876 teams consist of Skipper Robert Gustke/Crew Andrew York, and Skipper Aiden Meyer/Crew Cooper Pyle. Robert, Andrew and Aiden are OYC members, and Robert and Cooper are US Sailing Certified instructors who taught in our OYC Sailing

School last summer. At the last Koch Cup in 2016, OYC's Ship 876 team of Lucas and Aiden Meyer placed second in the Kiwi Division. Some OYC members have started a fund to help the scouts attend the Regatta in Galveston this summer. The goal is to raise a total of \$1000, and so far we have pledges to match up to \$500 in additional donations from OYC members. 



### **RACE WITH HISTORY**

The winner received a Silk Scarf from a "female admirer of the Yachtsmen" and his name on a perpetual trophy. We now recreate that race each year on Memorial Day, racing from the clubhouse to the outlet and back.

As we did last year, instead of turning in the outlet, there will be a racing mark to turn around. I would hope that every sailor, man or woman, will receive a silk scarf from an admirer, and fly it proudly from his or her boat for the rest of the summer! Skipper's meetings are at 1 pm all season, and the handicap racing series starts the Sunday after Memorial Day.
