

As we are all aware, once again, our beautiful state has been overwhelmed by the most recent fires. This is the most devastating fire as it has taken 56 lives with it. We have seen homes, pets and livestock lost. Insurance companies will help with the rebuilding but what about the reforestation?

This is where we as members of the California Federation of Women's Club come in. Each month we as individual clubs collect for Penny Pines. The Penny Pines Program was initiated in California in 1941. It started small, under the sponsorship of the San Francisco Sportswomen's Association in 1941. The minimum donation is \$68.00. To date, 59 years later, those pennies have amounted to well over 1 million dollars, and the program is a statewide conservation project supported by numerous individuals and organizations. During the past 59 years, the Penny Pines donations have helped maintain the National Forests in California. These donations are important now more than ever. The recent fires have destroyed over 200,000 acres and not all fires are 100% contained.

Trees are not only beautiful to look at or nice to sit under they also help cut down on pollution and aid in the prevention of landslides. Let's all help replenish and repopulate what's been destroyed by making this years Penny Pine contributions our record breaking year!

I'd also like to thank all those that have been ever so supportive by bringing your own coffee cup. Together we will make a difference!


