- 4. Spelling names correctly is very important
- 5. Minutes maybe required for legal reasons, keep it professional at all times.
- 6. Main points to capture: Actions and/or Task, Decisions and Motions, Dates, Calendar Events

7. Remember minutes should be easy on the eyes; Fonts and Charter size is important to your readers.

"Spanking a Child? Think Carefully Before Doing So!"

For a very, very long time in this country, spanking 'disobedient," "misbehaving" children on their bottoms was normal and fully acceptable as a means of discipline. This taught children that there were consequences for misdeeds. Parents routinely spanked their children when deemed necessary as a means of teaching their children what was right and what was wrong; to thwart their misbehavior. Spanking played a key part in character development. Even at school, principals were once authorized to spank children, and many did so with a wooden paddle. Spanking is still legal in California—yet only if the spanking is done on the child's bottom and if done with the open hand. Implements such as paddles and belts are strictly forbidden.

But, beware, dear readers. Yes, BEWARE! Consider the unforeseen consequences. What if you spank the child and then the next day, the child goes to school and suffers an injury that has nothing do with the spanking. Yes, this could very well happen. The "injured" child reports the injury to the teacher or teacher's aide and is sent off to be examined by the school nurse, who observes marks of an injury. The child then reports being injured, but also reports having been punished at home the previous night. The school authorities may very well file a police report, which leads to an investigation.

This very same scenario seems to have happened to California State Assemblyman Joaquín Arambula. He says he spanked his seven-year-old daughter on her buttocks for "acting out" on Sunday evening around 8:30 pm. He dropped her off at school on Monday morning and shortly thereafter, his family's troubles began. School authorities claimed to have observed an "injury" on his daughter. The police were called in and after a brief investigation, based on the child's statement(s) and those of the school authorities, California State Assemblyman Joaquín Arambula was taken to the police headquarters, and was booked on suspected "child abuse," a misdemeanor.

The Arambula family's nightmare doesn't stop there. Next to intervene were the staff from Child Protective Services, who removed the Assemblyman's three daughters (ages three, six, and seven, who were transported to the home of the Assemblyman's parents. The children are now back home but just imagine the tension and unease in their home. The local County District Attorney is still deciding whether or not to prosecute the Assemblyman. His political opponents are demanding he resign immediately from the office to which he was elected. His friends and relatives have all come to his defense—reporting him to be a "wonderful, loving father." Thus, a "simple spanking on the buttocks" can have totally unimaginable consequences. SO, BEWARE AND TAKE CARE!

- 5. Learning from work



During their long partnership, more than \$1 million have been raised through their International Outreach program to benefit Operation Smile.



#### MLK Day of Service Idea: Operation Smile's Stuffed Animal Drive

Children and families can experience significant obstacles to safe and timely surgical care. Clubs are encouraged to sew, collect or prepare specific supplies that Operation Smile needs for their medical missions. The GFWC Women's Club of Odessa, Inc. (Delaware) supported Operation Smile and used Facebook to put a call out to the community for stuffed animals. Their goal was to collect 200, but thanks to the Facebook community, they were able to collect 360 to send to Operation Smile for an upcoming mission. This club reached and surpassed their goal by using

social media to help them achieve their goal. Create a Facebook event for MLK Day to have a stuffed animal drive in your community. The project was listed in the GFWC Top 10 Projects.

Operation Smile has an urgent need for the following items: travel-sized toothpaste (at least 6 months from expiration date), child-sized toothbrushes, thin 8.5 x 11" coloring books, 8-count box of non-toxic crayons, non-toxic liquid bubbles, puzzles and pull toys. ### A Month of New Beginnings

January is more than just a colder, winter month. It's a month of new beginnings, resolutions and goals. A month we can resolve to donate blood and give the gift of life to kids receiving chemotherapy, undergoing heart surgery or to a victim of an automobile accident. Take a step further and encourage your network of friends and family to do the same! As collective individuals, we can make January a month of new beginnings for many unfortunate children and adults. So many of them are in need of OUR help!

Did you know that one unit of blood can save as many as three kids at just one children's hospital? So take a friend with you to donate and save up to six kids.

Why is Donating Blood Important?

There is no substitute for blood. We need at least 1,000 units of blood and about 200 platelet donors per month to help the kids at Children's Hospital Los Angeles. That's just one of the hospitals who need our blood donations. "Fresh" blood is always needed for infant patients. A single car accident victim can require as many as 100 pints of blood.

Blood, we take it for granted until we see it or, heaven forbid, we lose it. Every two seconds someone in the US needs blood, yet only 10% of eligible individuals donate. You, or someone you know, may be eligible.

As spoken by "Rebekah", age 13, who has Hodgkin Lymphoma, a cancer of the immune system that makes her vulnerable to infection: "If more people saw the amazing effect blood has on those who need it, they would definitely give blood."

By becoming a donor, we can give a new beginning for life to a sick child or a car accident victim. By donating on a regular basis, it ensures that this lifesaving liquid is ready and waiting when it's needed for someone in trouble. Start the year off right and give a new beginning to someone!


#### **President Scrapbook Chairman:** Pat Borchard(909-576-4382)


