WINTER

Girls Navy skirt/pinafore, plain navy socks/tights

Boys Grey trousers, grey socks

Blue shirt/blouse

Tie (available from nationwideschooluniforms.co.uk)

Navy cardigan/jumper (available from nationwideschooluniforms.co.uk)

Outdoor coat - plain black or dark blue (no obvious logos)

Navy blue coat with crest (available from nationwideschooluniforms.co.uk)

Shoes – black

Gloves – black / navy

Scarves – black / navy

Hats – black / navy

SUMMER

Girls Blue and white gingham dress, all white socks

Boys Blue short-sleeved shirt of a type with which a tie can be worn

Long or short grey trousers

Grey socks

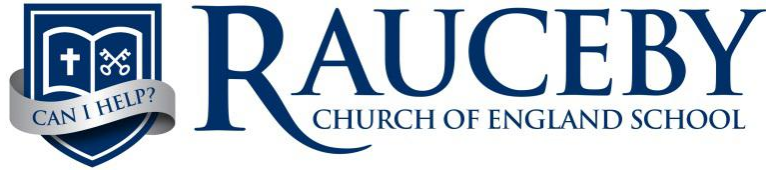
Shoes - black or dark blue (suitable for playground use)

All girls hair accessories must be blue.

PLEASE ENSURE THAT ALL ITEMS OF UNIFORM ARE MARKED CLEARLY WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME.

Jewellery, except for plain ear studs should not be worn in school for safety reasons and all ear studs should be removed for PE and games.

We actively but sensitively encourage the wearing of school uniform. This can be achieved by featuring regular articles in the Newsletter, discussion during assemblies and by discussion in class.



2. PE AND GAMES

All children should change for PE and Games. All children should wear clothing suited to physical activity appropriate to their age.

Indoors, children should wear shorts and P.E. T-shirt (available from nationwideschooluniforms.co.uk).

Children should take part in lessons in bare feet or plimsolls.

Outdoors, during warm weather children may use the same kit:

White polo shirt (embroidered available from nationwideschooluniforms.co.uk)

Navy shorts/skirts optional for girls

Black plimsolls or trainers

School sweatshirts can be worn for games/PE (available from nationwideschooluniforms.co.uk)

PE bag (available from nationwideschooluniforms.co.uk)

In Winter children should be warmly clad, for example in a dark blue track suit. Children playing football should wear boots or training shoes. In competitive games or serious training sessions children should wear shin pads for protection.

For swimming children need a costume which meets with the approval of the swimming teacher (no bikinis or Bermuda shorts). It is also asked, where possible, for swimming costumes to be in school colours. Swim hats must be worn in school colours (1st one is provided free of charge, subsequent ones are available from the school office). In addition a large towel is required.

A draw string bag is the most efficient method of carrying and storing kit.

A letter should be sent to parents if a child regularly misses PE (more than twice) as a result of “forgetting” PE kit.

3. SCHOOL TEAMS AND GROUPS

3.1 Children representing the school will be provided with the kit which must be returned for washing after each event. All those who take part in events at which they are on view to the general public and children and staff from other schools should dress appropriately.

4. SECOND-HAND CLOTHING

4.1 Many parents donate outgrown items for redistribution. A regular ‘new to you’ sale encourages further recycling of good clothing.
