Dig for Victory! - A plea from The Great Gardening Challenge Club

We will be entering the Schools' Challenge gardening competition at the Lincolnshire Show in June and we need to plant and prepare a show garden, as well as design a recipe book, diary and indoor stand. The theme this year is 'Dig for Victory' and we are looking for a range of props, artefacts or memorabilia, as well as wartime recipes, seeds and plants, pots and compost.

Can you help? We need:

Herb plants, seed potatoes, strawberry plants, little gem lettuce, broccoli/calabrese, cauliflower and spring onion seeds.

Medium-sized plastic pots (to grow and transport our plants) and plenty of compost.

Old gardening hand tools, small sandbags, 1 or 2 corrugated iron/plastic sheets.

2 sheets of rigid, weatherproof material (to use as an outdoor backdrop), which is paintable and about 1.2m x 1.2m.

Bunting and other WWII artefacts/memorabilia, particularly gardening-related.

Traditional wartime recipes.
