
Year 5 and 6 History Trip to Sleaford

Parking

Please can I remind parents to park sensibly and courteously outside of school. I understand how busy it can be but we have had complaints from local residents about parking on both sides of the road. Please could we avoid this and park on the school side of the road only. Also please respect the need to leave the first space outside of school for disabled parking, where there is a clear disabled sign on the fence. Use the nice weather as an excuse to arrive a little earlier and park further away, so you can enjoy a nice stroll into school.

<u>Uniform</u>

The recent change in the weather has been lovely. I would like remind parents that summer uniform is now permitted; this includes grey shorts for the boys and summer dresses for the girls with white socks. Plain navy blue (no logos) or Rauceby hats may also be worn and we highly recommend that your child brings one to school every day as they are spending more time out in the sun. We also encourage children to wear sun cream. The best way for children to be protected against the sun is if the sun cream is a long lasting version (usually 12 hours) and is applied before school. As you can probably imagine, 190 young children trying to apply sun cream themselves causes quite a lot of mess and disruption. Could I also remind parents that long hair should all be tied back and we do not permit nail varnish, make up or ear-rings other than studs. Thank you.

Swimming

This term Year 3 will continue their swimming lessons until Friday 27th April. Following that week, Year 2 will begin their lessons.

For swimming children need a costume which meets with the approval of the swimming teacher (no bikinis or Bermuda shorts). It is also asked, where possible, for swimming costumes to be in school colours. Swim hats must be worn in school colours (First one is provided free of

charge, subsequent ones are available from the school office for £1.00). In addition a large towel is required.
