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## Year 3 & 4 Trip to Bransby Horses Rescue and Welfare

On Wednesday the 6<sup>th</sup> June, Year 3 and 4 travelled to Bransby Horses Rescue and Welfare Centre. When we arrived, we were put into groups of three. Firstly, we learnt about how horses were used in the past compared to modern day machinery. For example, Shire horses were used for ploughing and today farmers use tractors and machines instead. Then, we looked at old newspapers with stories of some of the horses. Interestingly, Nipper and Nero [two of Bransby's donkeys] were rescued from a fire in their past. After that, we had a quick stop for lunch. Next, we learnt about different horses' body parts and compared them to human ones. Like how horses have monocular eyesight but humans have binocular eyesight, which means humans can only see in front of them and horses can see all around them.

We enjoyed our school trip and would love the opportunity to go back again and see all the horses we have adopted. Year 3 and 4 give thanks to the wonderful teachers and staff that came and organised the trip for us.
