# CARVER PROFILE: JIM IRISH

Jim Irish likes working with wood. He learned on his own by reading books and trying things he liked. He tried scroll saw carving and made lots of toys. When he became bored with that, he tried an intarsia piece. He had seen Chuck Friis' and Chuck Perry's work. It caught his interest and opened the door to new possibilities. It presented a challenge Jim couldn't resist.

He has a stockpile of wood. If he doesn't have wood with good character and grain, he goes to Rockler's in Rumford or Rare Woods in Mexico, Maine for prime hardwoods. Some people love varying shades of cedar. Jim looks for just the "right" piece. It takes an artist's eye to select the right wood to give realism and life to his subjects.

Intarsia must be done in his shop. He likes carving in the round because he can do it wherever he goes.

It makes him happy to make pieces for family members. He made treetop angels out of bird's eye maple and cherry. The angels sit on a shelf because the bases are bell shaped. He adds halo, face, torso and wings. The angels are lovely and greatly appreciated by the recipients. He makes delicate, open ornaments also.

Jim buffs his work because he does not use finishes or sprays. Buffing highlights the grain and natural color of the wood plus follows the contours of the animal or bird.

Jim offers this tip to get the sides of a 3D carving to match: Place the carving in front of a mirror so you can see how the other side looks.

Jim enjoys carving and wants to encourage others to try it. He wants to share and pass on his knowledge. He did a soap carving class with kids in Raymond, demonstrated scrollsaw carving to 3 different groups, carved at fairs and at MWCA events. Carving enriches his life through socializing, learning and sharing. He has entered competitions and earned awards and recognition. He earned a Blue Ribbon at the New England Show with his Ram's head and his Bobcat at the Maine Sportsman Show. He entered the Penobscot show in Belfast, the Top of Maine Show and our MWCA Annual Show and won awards at those as well. We'll be looking forward to seeing more of Jim's work.

# EAGLE CANE PROJECT NEWS

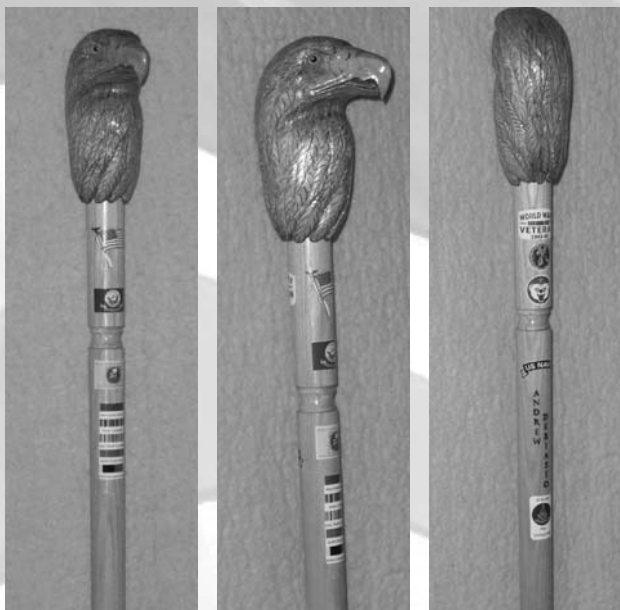

**CANE REQUEST UPDATE:** We currently have 35 requests that have not been picked up by a carver. Of those, 8 are WWII Vets, 3 are Korea Vets and there are 14 Vietnam Vets. Records also show about 40 requests that are signed out to carvers but not yet presented. I'm quite sure many of these have been delivered and will follow up with the carvers to correct the file. Great Progress, many thanks to all of you.

**CANE PRESENTATION CEREMONY:** We now have a date and time for the Veteran's Week Ceremony – it will be Friday Nov 8, 2013 in the Hall Of Flags starting at 1:30 pm. We've had a few carvers ask for names to support this event and look forward to more. Now that we've gotten started we'll be calling Vets to see who might be available to attend. We're working this in partnership with Peter Ogden, Director of Maine Bureau of Veteran Affairs so each vet will receive a certificate of appreciation from the State of Maine along with the MWCA/MWT Cane.

Maine Hall of Flags ( <http://www.maine.gov/legis/general/hlflag/flag2.htm> ) The Hall of Flags continues a tradition of honoring Maine's military men and women that began immediately after the Civil War and has continued into this century.

**CANES DELIVERED:** We know of 5 canes delivered in June. George Roy carved a cane for a Rumford Vietnam Army Veteran. Chuck Perry carved a cane for a highly decorated WWII Army Captain who served under Gen. Patton. Chuck and Luke Perry carved a cane for a WWII Army POW. Herb Blake carved a cane for a Brunswick WWII Navy Vet. Chuck Friis carved a cane for a WWII Marine Vet who made 4 different beach landings in the Pacific, including Iwo Jima. This cane was presented at the S. Paris Congregational Church where the minister incorporated the presentation into his service.

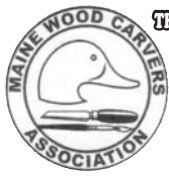

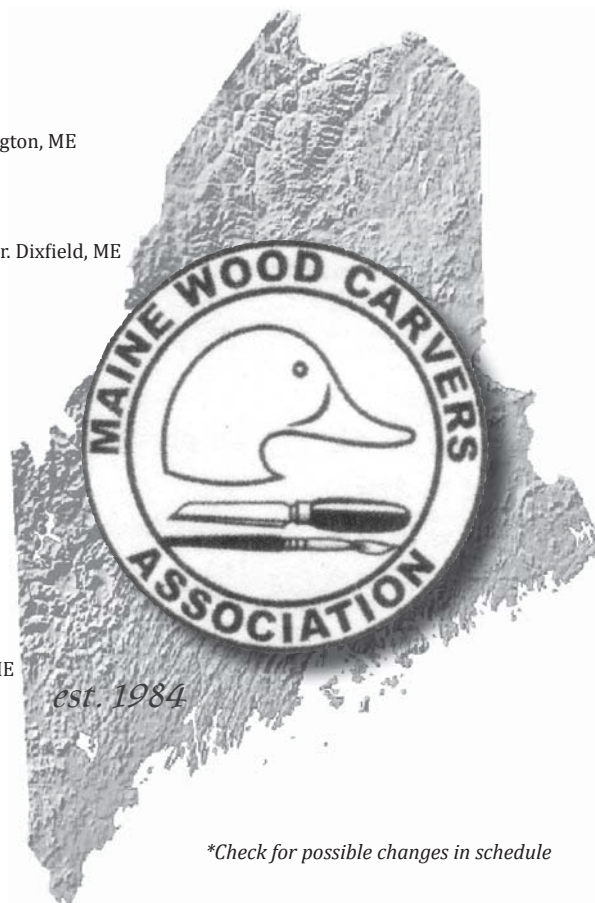
