Message from the Executive Director- Sandra Scherer Since our inception volunteers have been the lifeblood of Monument Crisis Center. Volunteers of all ages, backgrounds and abilities have shared their time, talent and enthusiasm with MCC.

At our first location and without a formal program, word of mouth spread in the community that Monument Crisis Center needed

help. People just showed up and we put them to work. Nowadays they call them spontaneous volunteers – we heralded them a godsend!

They did everything – accepted donations, wrote letters, sorted, boxed, and bagged food, assisted with client intake, data entry, phone calls, and cleaning. Soon they helped with legal aid clinics, taught ESL classes, tabled at events, and of course some joined our determined board of directors!

Clients and their children were regular fixtures helping around the Center alongside other families from the community at large. One afternoon we had 4 generations of a client family from ages 2-80 working in the tiny pantry. Giving back has always been a priority for families that receive from the Center and those that come to help. Parents want their children to understand, be appreciative and give back. Many of the kids that grew up with the Center keep it as a focal point in their lives becoming MCC high school tutors, volunteers, college interns, staff and donors! They continue to find ways to share MCC with their friends, colleagues, and family.
