She drafts the patterns for her quilts on graph paper, and loves to play with the design and find surprises along the way.

She has served as president of Utah Valley Quilt Guild, and chairman of the Springville Museum of Art Quilt Show. She has judged numerous quilt shows, and loves having her quilts judged so she can learn from the critiques. Her biggest thrill of the last few years was having her quilts accepted into AQS national shows in Paducah, KY, Grand Rapids, MI., and Lancaster, PA.
