There may be no more than 1 entry per class, per exhibitor in group classes. Proper dress, including a white shirt, white, tan or khaki pants and suitable footwear must be worn by exhibitors. Youth may show in both the youth and adult classes if they wish. Adults may not show in youth classes. All youth animals must have the exhibitor's name on the registration papers. Youth may exhibit animals that have been leased under 4-H, Breed Association or FFA programs. Signed lease papers and registrations must be available upon request, if applicable. Animals must have been leased by April 1, 2014, except spring calves, which must have been leased by May 1, 2014. Youth must enter a showmanship class. The Fair reserves the right to limit entries to 12 head per exhibitor.

Tips for exhibit Hall Entries

Be sure to read each departments rules and the fairs general rules. If you have any questions, please contact your department superintendent, they will be happy to assist you. Below are some of the tips to help get your entries ready for the fair.

Showing eggs: Eggs should be clean and uniform in size and color. Eggs should be placed in the carton Point side down.

Fruits and Vegetables: Fruits and Vegetables should be free of blemishes, insect damage, cuts and bruises. Exhibits should be cleaned and prepared as they would be for market. Do not peel onions and Do not scrub potatoes. Exhibits should not be too large or too small. They should have good texture and be of uniform size and color. Most vegetables are to be exhibited on disposable plates when practical with the exception of displays, baskets, bowls and trays.

Canning: All canned goods are to be processed using open kettles or hot water baths for jams, jellies, fruits and tomatoes. Use pressure for vegetables and meats. Products should be of the beat quality, uniform in size, of good color with good visual appeal. Liquids should be clear, free from sediment and air bubbles, must have the proper amounts in the jars. Containers should match and be labeled properly. Jams and jellies should be good color and consistency.

Baked goods: Baked goods will be judged on appearance, texture and taste. Recipes should be typed or handwritten and included with the exhibit. All baked items must be displayed on disposable plates or disposable tins for pies. Exhibits must be wrapped in clear plastic wrap or sealed in a zip top bags

Flowers and Plants: Cut flowers must be exhibited in containers that are able to hold a suitable amount of water and those that do not tip easily. Be sure to include sufficient stem length and foliage. Check each class to be sure of the proper number of specimens needed. Flowers and plants should be free of disease, dirt and Insect damage. They will be judged on condition, form or shape, stem and foliage, color and uniformity.

Crafts and Other Handiwork: All entries must be the work of the exhibitor. Items should be clean, in good condition and well-constructed. Sewing should be displayed on clothes hangers if possible. All items must have been made or completed within the past 12 months.

THE PREMIUMS IN THIS BOOK ARE BASED ON ESTIMATED RECEIPTS FROM THE FAIR, PLUS ANY ALLOTMENT THE MASSACHUSETTS DEPARTMENT OF FOOD AND AGRICULTURE MAY PROVIDE. GENERAL FAIR RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All entries, including exhibit hall must be received no later than July 25th. Exhibit hall entries will Not be received during check-in times. Please read the rules for each individual department and Feel free to contact department superintendents with any questions you might have.
2. Exhibit hall entries must be set up by Thursday between noon and eight (8) PM, and on Friday between 8 and 10 AM. Hall exhibits must remain until 4 PM on Sunday, Poultry, rabbits and other livestock will only be accepted and released during the times stated in each department of the Premium book. PLEASE READ THE RULES OF EACH DEPARTMENT CAREFULLY.
3. Youth may only enter in adult classes in the Exhibit Hall if there is no class for their age group. Youth Dairy, Beef Cattle and Sheep exhibitors may show in both youth and adult classes.
4. Entries failing to comply with the premium list requirements will be disqualified. All perishables must be replaced when necessary. Hall exhibits must not have been shown at the Littleville Fair in the past. Exhibits listed but not displayed will be disqualified.
5. Placements will be awarded on the basis of the quality of the exhibit. The decision of the judges will be final. The fair committee, judges or management, reserves the right to refuse any or all exhibits they feel are undesirable.
6. Youth exhibits are currently unmarried boys or girls, ages 9-19 as of January 1st of the current year. Children under 9 years of age may enter in special categories. Please see specific department for details.
