Understanding


- “Control the controllable” – know that you can only control what you contribute to the team; both on and off the field.

Coaches Philosophy



Our goal is to create a “Student-Athlete” centered program. To do this, as coaches and parents, we must work together to support:

Healthy lifestyle
Sportsmanship
& Citizenship

We hope to be approachable and supportive, to guide them to success as student-athletes....as well as young citizens in our community.

By its inherent nature, athletics are structured so that winning is the goal. While we will strive on a daily basis to be able to compete at a high level of play.....our priority is to build well rounded student-athletes, who know how to win with class....and yet lose with dignity; which are key life lessons. In life, our student-athletes will be faced with many forms of adversity and challenges, and will face losses far more severe than any they may experience on the field.

On the professional level....winning is required. At the collegiate level....winning has become expected. At the high school levelwinning should be a pleasant by-product of what we as coaches are really supposed to be doing; which is developing young people into productive citizens.

Program Policies

***** Players will be expected to attend all activities of the MVHS softball program, with only excused absences (as defined in this handbook) being the exception. Failure to comply can result in expulsion from the team.**

1. Maintaining academic standards is a must. Coaches will do random grade and attendance checks. Tutorials are available if you need help.
2. Players understand that we are a Softball Program, with a common goal of reaching the post season. Just because a player is chosen to play on the varsity team during tryouts, does not mean they are guaranteed that spot. The coaches can make changes as needed, to ensure that the “necessary” 9 players are on the field to try to win games at the varsity level; to work towards getting the MVHS Softball Program to the post season. We are not necessarily looking for the best players....but for the right players.
3. Be on time to practices, games, and related activities. All team members will practice. However, athletes must earn the right to play by demonstrating dedication to the team, a positive attitude, and consistent skill. It will be expected that every player arrive to practice prepared to *practice perfect*.
4. Excused absences will result in the player not being able to start in the following game.
Unexcused absences and tardiness:
 1. First Offense: the entire team will participate in the consequence
 2. Second Offense: the entire team will participate in the consequence and the player will be required to stay after practice
5. Poise is essential to superior performance. Helmet and bat throwing, use of profanity, and temper tantrums, do not display poise. Furthermore, negative attitudes toward the program, coaches, players, officials, or others will not be tolerated and may result in dismissal.
6. Sportsmanship is important, as is loyalty to school, coaching staff, and team members. Exhibit sportsmanship at all times. Show respect to coaches, teammates, opponents, and officials.
7. Use of alcohol, tobacco, or narcotics will result in disciplinary actions set forth by the District; as well as further disciplinary action set forth by the team. Multiple offenses will result in dismissal from the team.
8. Team members are responsible for their own equipment. School equipment and game uniforms must be properly cared for and returned at the end of the season. (uniforms laundered)
9. Players who appear in varsity level games during the season will earn their letter. Student managers who make a significant contribution to the team may also earn a letter.
10. If a player misses practice due to illness or injury, they will not be allowed to participate in practice or games without a note-of-release from parents, doctor, or trainer.

Cougar Softball Parents, “Friends & Family” Code of Conduct

1. Please get involved!! We are all a part of a softball family. Get involved through fundraising, field prep, concessions, providing team meals, and game attendance. We need and appreciate your help.
2. We will try our best to end practices on time. Please be understanding if we run long by a few minutes to finish up. Honking your horn does not help. (It is the responsibility of your child to inform you of schedule changes, not the coaches).
3. The coach’s job is to coach, while the parents/family friends “job” is to support the team in a positive manner.
4. Parents/Family & friends must remain in spectators areas at all times. Please refrain from entering the dugout or from talking with the players during a contest. If you need to communicate with **your** child please do so through the dugout coach.
5. There may be times **your** player has complaints or issues with the program or coaches. **Players** must address an issue with the Head Coach first before a parent may get involved.
6. Do not approach coaches prior to, during, or following a contest. If you have things that you wish to discuss about **your** child, please wait until after a practice; or you may e-mail (lindseygrosch89@gmail.com) to set up a more appropriate time.
7. *****Coaches will not discuss playing time, game strategy, play calling, etc. before, during, or after a contest.***** If you would like to speak with a coach we ask that you set an appointment at an appropriate time; again, via e-mail (lindseygrosch89@gmail.com).
8. Playing time is earned. Hard work and dedication, along with positive attitude will always be considered first; with skill and understanding of game situations to be the final factor.
9. *****Because of the potential negative impact on the team; repetitive poor parent/family & friend behavior may result in that individual being restricted or dismissed from attending practices and/or games. We reserve the right to sit your player until this is complied with*****
10. Sportsmanship does not only apply to the players, but to the parents as well. Show respect and good sportsmanship to all participating players, coaches, and officials.

Our practices are always open for parents to watch. But please remain in the spectator areas.
