

The PETS Act

PETS - Pets Evacuation and Transportation Standards Act

Legislation passed in October 2006

Amends the Stafford Act

Requires state and local disaster preparedness plans to take into account the needs of individuals with household pets and service animals

Includes establishing shelters to accommodate people with pets and service animals

Allows for funding from FEMA






Animal Response Organizational Structure
