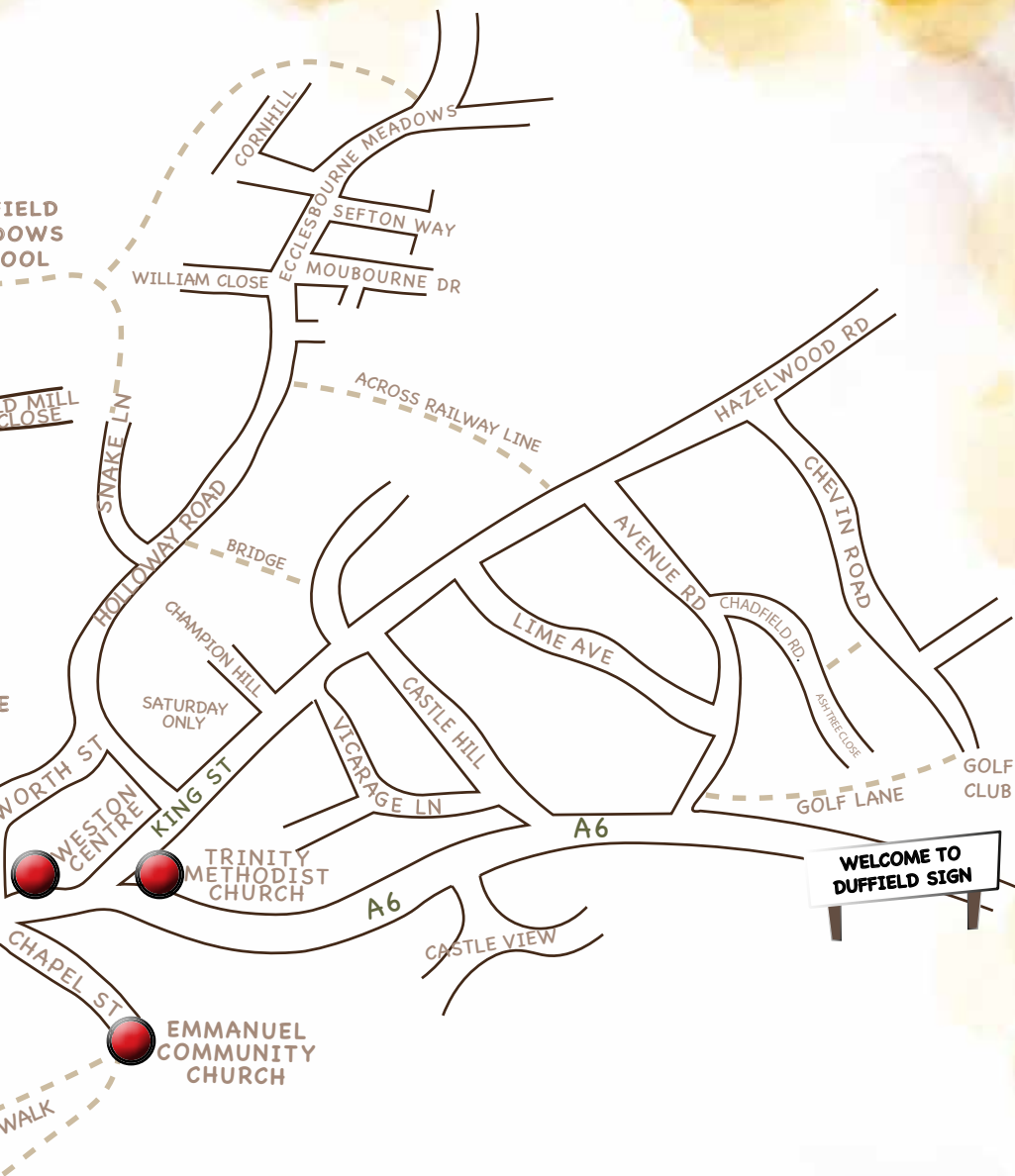

From Fighting Crime to Writing Crime

Listen to a fascinating talk by Trevor Negus as he gives an interesting insight into his 30 years' service in the police force from the late 1970's, starting in Hyson Green, then Mansfield through the miners' strike, into Special Ops with time as a bodyguard and sniper through to CID. He speaks of his passion for writing and becoming a successful author.

During a varied thirty year police career Trevor spent six years as an authorised firearms officer and police sniper before transferring onto CID. He spent the last twelve years of his career as a detective becoming a specialist interviewer involved in the planning and implementation of interviews with murder suspects. He retired from the Police in 2007 and is now the director of a specialist Laser Clinic and Training Academy. He now combines running the training academy with writing. His first novel 'The Coal Killer' is a very dark crime thriller set in Nottinghamshire in 1984 at the heart of the year long bitter miners strike. It centres on the relationship forged between two men from completely different backgrounds who are thrown together by

circumstance and who then recognising their identical murderous natures embark on a deadly killing spree across the County.

A keen writer throughout his adult life he regularly contributed short stories for magazines. He has now taken the decision to devote most of his working life to writing and has now completed two other thrillers, The Exodus Murders and A Different Kind of Evil completing the Ch Insp Flint trilogy. His fourth book Two Wrongs will be released shortly.

Sophie also works as a traditional oral storyteller, performing folk stories and songs for historic houses, museums, community groups and schools.



In *Cuckoo*, Caro, an illustrator, returns to her childhood home and is haunted by disturbing memories that echo the dark tales of her latest commission. Obsessed with one story in particular, she gradually uncovers family secrets, village hatred and a guilt too much to bear.

Cuckoo was a Fern Britton Pick and won the Bath Novel Award 2017 and the Friday Night Live award at the York Festival of Writing 2017.

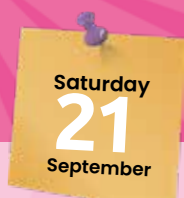

The countdown is now on to this year's Duffield Scarecrow Trail... and what a spectacle it promises to be! Once again we'll have around 70 scarecrows on display across the village, so get ready to join in and have fun seeing how many you can find!

The Trail will run from Wednesday 11th until Sunday 15th of September, with the Duffield Arts Festival taking place over the following weekend. The theme for this year is 'My Favourite Song or Piece of Music' – and without giving too much away, you'll be able to see scarecrows covering all musical genres, from nursery rhymes to reggae, from punk to pop, from hymns to musicals.

And this year, we've got a first for the Scarecrow Trail! To tie in with our musical theme, you will be able to hear each of the favourite songs on your mobile phone as you go round the trail, via a QR code which will be printed on the trail markers. (QR code readers can be downloaded onto mobile phones for free from the App Store).

To help you find your way around the Trail, brochures containing a map of the location of all the scarecrows are now on sale from Duffield News, the White Hart,



the Town Street Tap and Treetops Hospice Care shop (all on Town Street). They will also be available from our pop up stall outside the White Hart on the Saturday and Sunday. You will then be able to follow the Trail, find out where all the tea stops are, take part in the scarecrow quiz and vote for your favourite scarecrow.

We can't wait for what is set to be another fantastic scarecrow celebration for the village... and we hope you can't either! Thank you to everyone who has taken the time to make a scarecrow, you have made it a very special event.

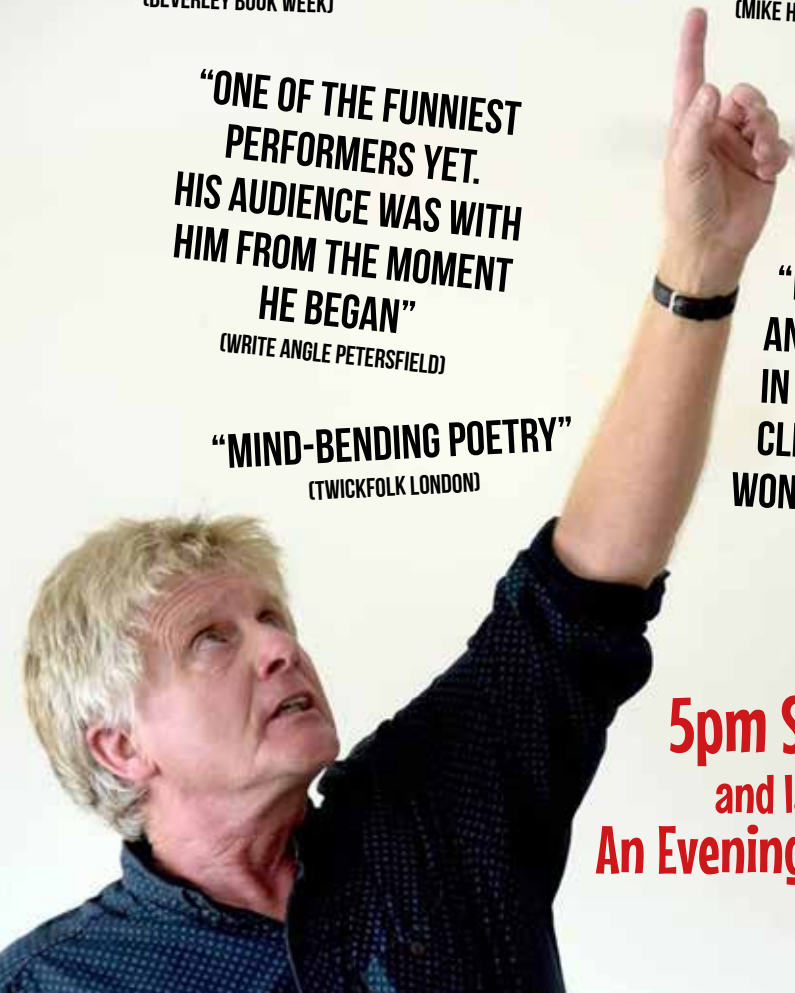
