From Pastor Carrie

Greetings in This New Year!

I hope everyone had some time with their family and friends during the holiday season! There is nothing like being together and surrounded by love. I want to extend a heartfelt thanks to all who prayed for me and my family with the passing of my father and his subsequent memorial service. It was soul soothing to hear all the stories about my dad and how he impacted so many in the faith. There were many tears, but also much joy and laughter- a true witness to the resurrection and a celebration of life.

This New Year is already starting off with some changes in the life of the church. As you know, the Committee on Ministry (COM) of our Presbytery suspended the PNC process so that there can be a time of coming together with a unity of vision and a space for discerning God's desired future for BPC. You will be hearing further information from the Session about how we will structure this time together.

There seems to be some confusion here at BPC about what this interim period is all about. The interim period is a time of focusing on 5 different areas of church life. It is NOT a time where the interim pastor just holds your hands until a new installed pastor appears. It is supposed to be an introspective, interactive, discerning and transformative time where exploration, conversations, and experimentations are done so that a new vision for your church emerges. It takes time and almost always there is change and disorientation until a new structure, vision and mission takes its place. I know this is difficult. Some of you are angry about the Presbytery's decision. I hope and pray that you may see this as an opportunity to strengthen BPC's life and love- there is nothing more important now than this. The promises of God that God is always with us and guiding us in these difficult times is what we hang on to as we go through the process of emergence. I hope that Proverbs 3:5-6 speaks to all of us:

*Trust in the LORD with all your heart;
do not depend on your own understanding.
Seek God's will in all you do,
and God will show you which path to take.*

Please see below for the different areas of foci and the 4 questions that are posed for each of the Interim tasks. You will hear more about the process of a way forward at the Annual Congregational Meeting. We ask that you continue to pray and be open to the Spirit's movement as the way forward becomes clear.

BPC continues to work on the 5 developmental tasks in the transition period before BPC calls a new installed pastor. Please take a look at the tasks below and ask yourselves these questions for each of those tasks:

1. Where has God challenged us or awakened us within this task?
2. Where have we seen God's Spirit move us in this task?
3. What specifically have we done to address the themes in this task?
4. Do we sense that we are as done as we are going to get in completing this task or is there still more to do?

1. Coming to Terms with History

Following a pastor's departure, a congregation usually needs to resolve its feelings of loss, grief, anger, relief and guilt as well as panic about the future. "Letting go" of the previous pastor is a critically important task for a congregation as it begins to prepare for a new pastoral leader.

Moreover, a church sometimes has issues or conflicts that need to be addressed if forward progress is to be possible. If there is much grief or deep conflicts, the church members can find themselves exhausted and burned out. Many times there is a need to renew a congregation's spiritual energies to move toward a positive atmosphere within the church.

2. Discovering a New Identity

As the search for a new pastor proceeds, it is essential that the Leadership Team, Search Committee and the congregation have a clear sense of the church's identity, mission and purpose based on a number of factors, including a church's past and an understanding of its strengths and the discernment of God's desired future for ministry in this time and place. This self-understanding is the end result of a careful self-assessment by a congregation and activities and learnings done by the leadership, PNC and congregation that help bring forth that new identity.

3. Strengthening Patterns of Lay Leadership

In the interim period a church may experience shifts in power or leadership among the laity, depending upon the relationships of individuals to the former pastor. Some leaders may recede into the background while new leaders may emerge in this period. Gratitude for service rendered as well as cultivation of new leadership is important. Furthermore, this is a time to assess, as a whole, patterns of lay involvement in the church.

4. Strengthening Denominational Ties

In the interim period, congregations find themselves working more closely than usual with the denomination, particularly with Presbytery staff and resources. It is an opportune time to affirm the church's connection to the larger church and the benefits such a relationship has for the congregation.

5. Preparing for New Leadership

During the search process, two significant tasks are going on simultaneously: the Search Committee, on behalf of the congregation, is fulfilling the necessary steps in the process of finding a new pastor AND the congregation is readying itself psychologically and spiritually to enter into partnership with a new leader.
