GE Receives A Helping Hand On Several Upgrade Projects

Construct Flaglands Preserve Sign and Revitalize the Demonstration

Garden Boy Scout Joseph Prest worked toward his Eagle Rank this past spring by helping Green Earth with two projects at our Flaglands site. Joseph assembled a crew to construct a preserve sign mount and to revitalize the demonstration prairie garden.

The garden was first spot-sprayed for undesirable plants, especially encroaching woody vegetation. Local pollinator garden enthusiast Patty Wyrich transplanted seedlings from the demonstration prairie at Oakland seedlings removed from the walkway and culled from the crowded garden. Materials for the project were supplied by GE.

14 ft ADA Footbridge In mid-May a combined crew from Carbondale Lions Club and Habitat for Humanity replaced an existing

footbridge on the ADA Friendly trail with a much larger, sturdier bridge which includes handrails. The trail will be ramped to the new deck height as soon as site conditions allow.

The project was proposed by Dick Daesch and developed by Jim Dooley - both longtime GE supporters and Lions Club members. Joe Lenzini of ET Simonds and Jim Nesler of Habitat for Humanity were both instrumental in logistics and planning.

The Lions Club generously donated \$1,000 to cover the materials and supplies.

12 ft ADA Footbridge In late June Boy Scout Raeden Bowker worked toward his Eagle Rank by planning, organizing, and executing the construction of the second ADA footbridge on the ADA Friendly Trail. This footbridge uses the same design as the earlier bridge and is much sturdier than the bridge it replaced. Ramping of the trail to the new deck height will also need to be completed as soon as site conditions allow.
