The One and Only Original Bullitt Mustang

So what would your answer be if Harry Davis called you up and said "I've been invited to an exclusive event put on by a group of car owners that includes a cocktail party and hors d'oeuvres and a chance to see the *original* Bullitt car used in the movie and a preview of the brand new 2019-version of the Bullitt. It is a space that has been converted into a showplace for a group of wealthy collectible and exotic car owners to show off their various "toys". Most of you know the story of the re-discovery of the only remaining Bullitt car that has been in the same family for over 40 years and they used it as a daily driver for several years after they acquired it in the mid-70s.
