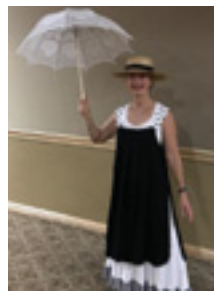

Marion, I am sure you will have a wonderful time during the next twelve months representing Palomar!

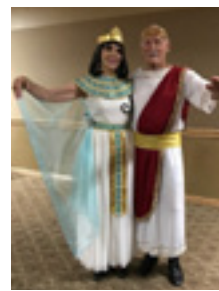

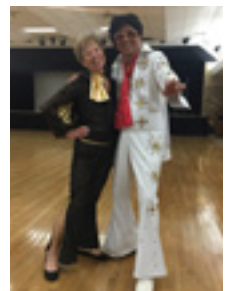

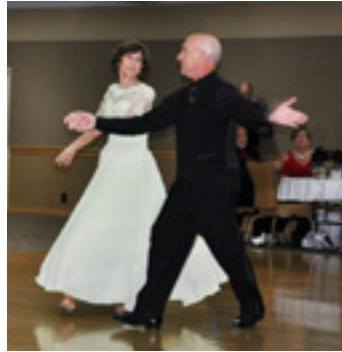

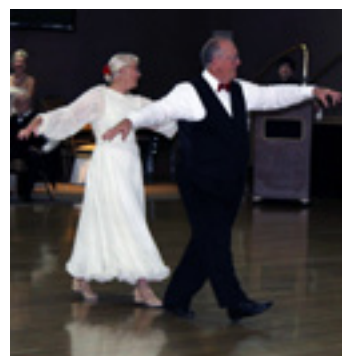

This past July Angela had her first experience accompanying Steve on a one-week rebuild in Denham Springs, LA (30 mi east of Baton Rouge).

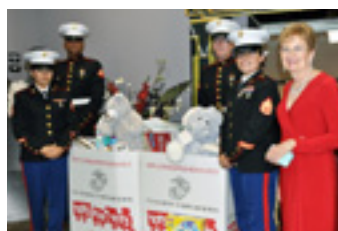

In addition to adaptive dance classes and programs in schools and community settings, WDO engages in outreach activities and performs at dance-ability showcases, fund raisers and other special events.

Plans are coming together nicely for our upcoming annual dance Boards. They are being held the weekend of March 23-25, 2018. I hope you are making plans to attend this annual event.

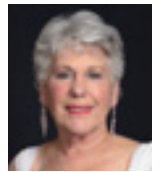
We will be crowning our Queen-elect, Kay Boyer. This weekend is always a special event filled with dancing, competitions and professional dancers!

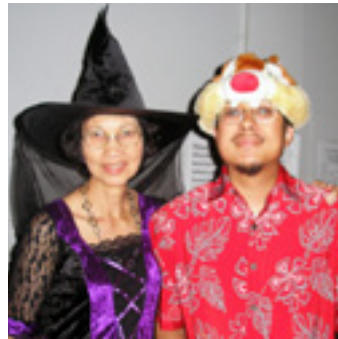
