### And the cycle continues.....

Early dark is here, early sunshine is gone.

Leaves of green gave way to red, now gone with the rains.

The bikes are cleaned and stored away, on their little trickle chargers.

And now we change from 2 (or 3) wheels to 4.....



With this change we become those drivers that we oft complain about, but we are better prepared and more aware. Here are some driving tips to ensure safe winter driving, courtesy of the AAA magazine.

1. **Winterize.** That includes your car and yourself. Make needed repairs and then have the battery tested, washer fluid refilled and wiper blades replaced. For yourself, keep an emergency kit in your car along with a spare blanket. Always comes in handy.
2. **Clean up before heading out.** Clear all snow or ice from windows, mirrors, lights and signals. You want to see and be seen. May even want to consider doing a T-CLOC on your car once in a while.
3. **Maintain traction.** Brake and accelerate slowly. Maintain an even speed, steering slowly and smoothly. Avoid jerky motions. No one gets to their destination faster if they don't get there at all.
4. **Leave early.** Allow plenty of time to reach your destination. Be the rabbit, not the hare. Slow and steady.
5. **Hang back.** Remember group riding. Keep that proper spacing, like we do on the bikes. But instead of 2-3 seconds, try to keep 8-10 seconds between you and the car ahead of you. It takes our cars longer time and distance to stop, especially with wintry road conditions.



Being prepared for winter driving is really no different than the way we prepare for riding our motorcycles. Prepare the vehicle, prepare the safety and prepare ourselves mentally.

## CHAPTER TABLE CENTERPIECE CONTEST

Submit passport by mail or in person to the Assistant District Director (ADD) for your section.

Obtain a new passport from your Chapter Director (CD) or ADD

Each properly completed passport enters you into a drawing to win free registration of your choice to one of the following: Cabin Fever, Buckeye Rally, or Region D Rally

Completed passports must be turned in on or before noon on Saturday of the Fall Officer's Meeting

Any conflicts arising with the passports will be resolved by the Ohio District Director. GWRRA of Ohio is not responsible for any lost passports.

### The Passport Plus

- Your registration must be received or postmarked by **designated date** for Cabin Fever. You will then receive one Passport Plus entry form in your registration packet. This entry form when completed and returned will allow you one additional entry for the Passport Drawing.
- Your registration must be received or postmarked by **designated date** for Buckeye Rally. You will receive one Passport Plus entry form in your registration packet. This entry form when completed and returned will allow you one additional entry for the passport drawing.
- Your passport plus will also register you for the passport plus drawing. All entries must be turned in on or before noon of the Fall Officer's Meeting to be eligible.
- The winner of the passport plus drawing will receive free registration for themselves and their guest to **Wing Ding**.
- Any conflicts arising with the passport plus will be resolved by the Ohio District Director. GWRRA of Ohio is not responsible for any lost passports.
