Nehemiah Construction Ministries

A quick report from the Turkana desert

Well everybody loves to hear praise reports, and so I want to share some great news. Back in October 2015 I got an email from a guy in Anchorage Alaska. He (Larry Falldorf) was interested in the work we do in the Turkana region and through our four a half hour phone conversation I found out that he is an experienced percussion driller, and was heading to Kenya to try and set up a ministry. The more we talked the more he became interested in NCM and how he could be a part of what we are doing in Kenya. We decided to meet in Kenya and travel to the Turkana desert to check out our drilling rig. Even though it was the first time in years that it has rained for so many months, we were able to get to the rig only twice but in that time we were able to come up with a plan to start raising funds to rebuild the drilling rig.

After spending our time together in Kenya with Dave Nelson and Larry Falldorf and myself and with much prayer, Larry and his wife Joyce decided to join Nehemiah Construction ministries as part of our team. This for me it was a great answer to prayer, both Larry's and mine, we made a plan to meet back in Kenya in early January and that's where we are now. **(Larry and Joyce are totally self funded and do not want any compensation from Nehemiah Construction)** We have dismantled the drilling rig and inspected all our parts and pieces and are trying to come up with a budget right now, Right now we would really appreciate your prayer for wisdom and that we would make the right decisions on the repairs that need to be done. The rig has been patched together over the past 40 years but we believe now is the time to fix it properly and possibly get another 20 years of service out of it. I was originally hoping to raise \$65,000 Canadian and I still believe that is about the number we will need because of the US dollar and the British pound being where they are in today's market. So far I have raised approximately \$30,000 towards that goal but we are in need of some extra help. I would ask that you would prayerfully consider partnering with to help us achieve this goal and provide clean

drinking to the Turkana people for the years to come and please remember there is no amount too small.

We are very confident that the repairs to the drilling rig and Larry's experience as a seasoned percussion driller will increase production immensely. In the past three years we have had many hurdles to overcome and I believe 2016 is the year to see breakthrough. As you're reading through this I would also ask that you may consider sending it to at least one person you know that they might have an opportunity to make a difference in the world!
