We are excited to announce that the Nehemiah Rescue Center is finally up and running.

Pastor Wilson and Alice Kariuki have done an excellent job in setting up the rescue center and turning it into a home for the 3 boys that have become family.

Alice says that the boys are already responding well to their new home situation. The boys are Michael Ejiot 5 years of age, Boniface Emulia 7 years of age and his younger brother 4 year old, Evans Emulia .

Micheal's dad was killed during a goat raid between the Ugandans and the Turkanas. All the family's belongings were stolen by their neighbors. His mother is extremely poor and has 6 more children to take care of. Her financial situation is to a point that she cannot afford to feed the children every day.

Boniface and Evans were left to die in the desert by their mother and then she disappeared. Luckily, an old Turkana mama found them but was struggling a lot to take care of the boys. Nobody knows their father's whereabouts. When Pastor Wilson took the boys to give them safety, the old mama could not stop thanking God for everyone who had contributed to getting the center started.

Up to this point to boys were transported from Turkana to Kitale in western Kenya. The boys have received their shots, a new home to live and are already attending school for the first time ever.

We have been so blessed to have Alice's sister, Faith, move to Kitale to be part of this new ministry. She has a great love for children and was immediately willing to come and take care of

them. Faith holds a certificate in Early Child Education and has also completed the diploma course in ECD.

We continue to look forward to what God has is store for these 3 boys and the others that are to join them.
