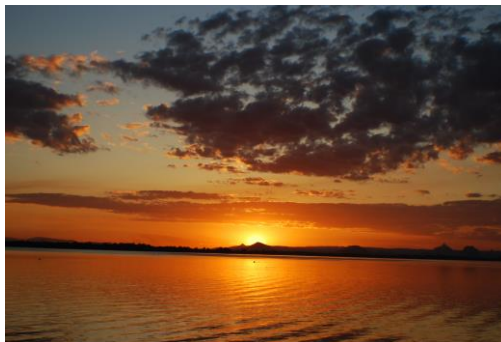
## Scripture

## Prayer

O God of Creation, open our ears to your voice that you may create us anew.  
O Lord of the burning bush, open our ears to hear you where we least expect it.  
O God of the whirlwind, help us to hear your voice even when it may seem overwhelming.  
O Lord of the earthquake, wind and fire, open our ears to hear your still quiet whisper.  
Open our ears, Lord, that in the midst of busyness, distraction, anxiety and distress  
we will not miss the words of comfort, hope, healing or guidance you have for us.

## Reflection

*There is power in the word of God.*

*When God speaks, creation responds: new life comes into being,  
and there is healing, deliverance and freedom.  
God speaks and lives are transformed.*

*God spoke to Jacob in a dream at night, and to many others in dreams.  
He spoke to Moses out of a burning bush, to Elijah in a still whisper, to a young boy and a new king in the  
quietness of the night, and to a questioning Job out of a whirlwind.  
Each of these encounters led to significant changes of direction.*

*(Gen 46:1-4; Exodus 3:1-6; 1 Kings 19:11-13; 1 Samuel 3; 2 Chron 1:7-12; Job 38:1-7)*

*And then... the Word of God became flesh and dwelled amongst us! (John 1:14)*

*Jesus is the spoken word of God.*

*He speaks – and the wind and the waves, and demons obey.*

*He speaks a word and the blind see, the lame walk, and the dead live again.*

*God speaks in so many different ways: in a thundering roar, in a quiet whisper, through dreams and visions, through the elements of the created world, and through His Holy Spirit.*

*There is power when God speaks.*

*Reflect for a moment on how you have heard God's voice in the past...*

*What was the context?*

*How has the power of God's Word impacted the way you live out your faith?*

*In what other ways have you heard God speak?*

*What do you need to do to recognise the voice of God, and prepare yourself to listen?*

### Prayer of Thanksgiving

Thank you, Lord, for every word of comfort and consolation you have spoken to us.

Thank you for speaking in power into our lives and transforming and renewing us.

We thank you for your words of guidance and direction, and for giving us clarity.

*Pause for silent thanksgiving*

Forgive us, Lord, for the times we have failed to recognise your voice or have ignored you.

Renew our desire and expectation to hear from you directly.

Prepare us to listen and remove each distraction that overpowers your voice.

Teach us to recognise your voice more readily – whether it is the still quiet voice, or the roaring thunder.

Thank you, Lord, that you still speak to your children.<sup>iii</sup>

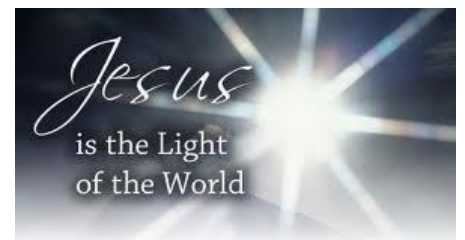
### Scripture

## Listening to God

He awakens me morning by morning,

### HOW DOES GOD SPEAK TO US?

#### Personally

Then the LORD said, „Listen to my words: When a prophet of the LORD is among you, I reveal myself to him in visions, I speak to him in dreams. But this is not true of my servant Moses; he is faithful in all my house. With him I speak face to face, clearly and not in riddles; he sees the form of the LORD.“  
(Numbers 12:6-8)

I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me ... I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd. My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. (John 10: 14-16 and 27)

#### Through dreams and visions

And afterwards, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams, your young men will see visions. (Joel 2:28)

#### Through the Holy Spirit (John 16:13)

Paul and his companions travelled throughout the region of Phrygia and Galatia, having been kept by the Holy Spirit from preaching the word in the province of Asia. When they came to the border of Mysia, they tried to enter Bithynia, but the Spirit of Jesus would not allow them to. (Acts 16:6-7)

#### Through His Word

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. (2 Timothy 3:16-17)

#### Through other believers

Trusted friends, mentors, spiritual directors, ministers

#### Through voices, angels, nature

Revelation 1:9-10; Matthew 2:13 (Joseph); Ps 8;

## WE ARE COMMANDED TO LISTEN

- Listening together

- Journaling

- Throughout the day

## GOING DEEPER

Here are some suggestions that may help you to engage more deeply with this theme.

- **The Bible** records many occasions when God spoke to his people in some way, either as individuals or as a people. He speaks through dreams and visions, through creation, through prophets, through circumstances, directly through His Spirit and through his Word. His voice can be loud and clear, or quiet and mysterious. Often he speaks in unexpected ways and we might not always recognise that it is his voice. Choose a Biblical passage that describes an encounter where God speaks to one of his people.

Read the passage through slowly. Reflect on how God speaks, how it impacts the hearer and what happens next. Think about what God might be saying to you through his words.

Here are some examples: Gen 46:1-4; Exodus 3:1-6; 1 Kings 19:11-13; 1 Samuel 3; 2 Chron 1:7-12; Job 38:1-7; Acts 10:9-15; and any of the Gospel encounters with Jesus.

- **Reflect** on how God has spoken to you in the past. What was your response? What did you learn about God from this experience and how has that impacted your relationship with him? Have you noticed times when you have found it hard to hear God's voice, or when you have resisted what you heard him say to you? Is there any insight you gain from this?
- You could use one of the Bible passages or one of the songs provided in the material to practise **Lectio Divina**. (see page 8)
- **Visualise Scripture!** Choose a Bible passage that describes someone hearing God speak to them (such as any of the above). Read it through slowly – all of it or some selected verses. Close your eyes and picture what is being described. What do you see, smell, hear? How is God revealing himself to you through this? You could either record this experience in your journal or share it with someone.
- If you enjoy being **creative**, reflect on a time when you have heard God's voice in an unexpected way and find a way to express that creatively. You can create a collage of how that encounter impacted you, or draw, paint, use clay, write a poem or compose a song. Think about how he has spoken to you and the words he said, and be creative.
- Go for a **walk**. What do you notice as you walk? Do you hear the voice of God in any way around you? Listen to how he speaks through the world around him and think about how you might like to respond to what you hear. If God is silent, is there something you can learn from that? You might want to write your own psalm to go with it.
- If you are **sharing** this retreat day with someone else, spend some time sharing your experiences. Pray together.
- If you like to **journal**, make a note of what you have experienced during this retreat time in your journal. A simple way to do this is to:

**Thank God** for Who He is and what He is doing in your life

**Notice** what is happening around you and in you

**Respond** to what God has shown you, by thanking Him, repenting, or recommitting yourself to Him

- **Simply sit in His presence.** We don't have to do anything to enjoy being in His presence! We are in His will when we are fully and completely in His presence, with our hearts focussed on Him.



## **EVEN DEEPER**

### **LECTIO DIVINA**

Lectio Divina is an ancient spiritual practice from the Christian monastic tradition. Its title derives from the Latin words meaning reading and divine/holy. In Lectio Divina, we seek to experience the presence of God through reading and listening, meditation, prayer, and contemplation. Lectio Divina can be practiced both by individuals and in groups.

#### **Practicing Lectio Divina Individually**

##### **1. Text**

Begin by choosing a section of Scripture that you would like to read and pray. You can choose the text randomly or use a liturgical book, such as The Book of Common Prayer. Try not to set a goal for how much content you will cover; the goal is to listen for God and to experience his presence.

##### **2. Preparation**

Do what you must to quiet and prepare yourself to hear from God. If you need to find a quiet room, sit in silence for several minutes, or sit in a comfortable chair, take whatever posture will help you prepare to receive and experience God's presence.

##### **3. Reading/Listening**

When you sense that your heart is prepared, begin by slowly reading the passage of Scripture that you have selected. Move slowly through sentences and phrases. As you read, pay attention to what word, phrase, or idea catches your attention.

##### **4. Meditation**

Begin to meditate on the word, phrase, or idea that has captured your attention. Repeat it again and again.

Consider:

What thoughts come to mind as you meditate on this word, phrase, or idea?

What are you reminded of in your life?

What does it make you hope for?

Meditation is no easy task—as you try to concentrate don't be disappointed if random thoughts enter your head. As they do, offer them to God.

##### **5. Prayer**

Now begin to speak to God. Tell God what word, phrase, or idea captured your attention and what came to mind as you meditated upon it. How is God using this word, phrase, or idea to bless and transform you? Tell God what you have been thinking and feeling as you've listened and meditated. Tell God how you hope this word, phrase, or idea will change your heart to be more like His.

##### **6. Contemplation**

Finish by focusing your attention on the fact that God's presence is with you. If as you try to focus on God's presence you sense a need to read the text again, to continue meditating, or to simply continue talking with God, allow yourself to do so. As you do, know that you are in the presence of God.

## THE PRAYER OF EXAMEN - Finding the movement of the Spirit in our daily lives as we review our day.

This is something that can be done throughout the day or at the end of the day. It helps us to become more aware of and focused on the presence of God in the midst of everyday life.

### 1. Recognize the presence of God

Be still and know that you are with God.

### 2. Look at your day with gratitude

Acknowledge God in the big and small things of life.

### 3. Review your day

When or where in the past 24 hours did you feel you were cooperating most fully with God's action in your life? When were you resisting?

#### Ask yourself

- What habits and life patterns do I notice?
- When did I feel most alive? Most drained of life?
- When did I have the greatest sense of belonging? When did I feel most alone?
- When did I give love? Where did I receive love?
- When did I feel most fully myself? Least myself?
- When did I feel most whole? Most fragmented?

### 4. Reconcile and Resolve

- Seek forgiveness
- Ask for direction
- Share a concern
- Express gratitude
- Resolve to move forward
