FIRST DESTINATION SURVEY RESULTS - CLASS OF 2017 - UNDERGRADUATE AND GRADUATE

This first destination survey was administered to graduating students on May 5, 2017. 107 students responded regarding their career plans for graduate school, employment or both. Thus, the overall response rate was 71%.

81% reported that they are prepared for the next step in their careers. The average full-time salary reported for undergraduate and graduate students: \$44,370.00.





Places of Employment








6 Months Later

This 6-month survey was administered to the Class of 2017 approximately 6 months post-graduation. 149 alumni were contacted and 94 of them responded regarding updates on their careers. The overall response rate was 63%.

Survey methods included phone calls, LinkedIn messaging, Facebook messaging, and emails.



The 8% in the "Neither" category reported traveling, job searching, spending time with family, or studying for graduate admissions exams. Of those pursing further education, 65% had also secured employment or a graduate assistantship.

92% of alumni respondents reported being employed or in graduate/professional school. Of those, 50% graduated in the sciences, 23% graduated in the arts and humanities, and 36% graduated in business, economics, and accounting.

(NOTE: 16% were double majors.)
