NEW SOUTH WALES

Riverina | **Nugan Estate**
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Abruzzo - technically speaking lies in the South of Italy, though geographically it is much more central, with Marche to the north, Lazio to the west, Molise to the south east and the Adriatic Sea to the east. Thanks to the Maritime influence and planting at altitude the region is seeing a strong move from large volume wineries to stunning boutique wineries.

Talamonti Estate was established in 2001 as a result of the introduction of innovative winemaking techniques to an historic wine making area. This move was generated by the Di Tonno family's tremendous passion for wine and a strong attachment to the local roots. The founders kicked off this adventure with the mission to promote the regions dowry: Unique grape varieties of tremendous potential: Montepulciano and Trebbiano d' Abruzzo.

ZELLINA

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Piedmont is an interesting region, similar to Burgundy in the sense that many of the wineries are family estates, farming small parcels of land. Unlike many of its wine producing neighbours, Piedmont is land locked and mountainous. The terroir lends itself beautifully to big powerful reds not surprisingly leading to many award winning wines and international recognition.

GOVONE

Founded in 1957 by Giovanni Dalmasso - a leading figure of viticulture at that time. The company had a clear goal to showcase the natural resources of the Langhe hills. Today the vineyards have expanded to 270 hectares of which 60% are cultivated with Barbera d'Asti, although 5 hectares are used for experimentation in growing organically. The winery, which leans on the Govone hill, in the valley towards Alba carefully craft each wine to ensure the consistent quality level it has become renowned for.

PECCHENINO

Production began towards the end of the 18th century. It has always been family managed and though the years has been handed down from father to son. Today the vineyard totals about 25 ha, of which 22 are in the community of Dogliani and 3 in the Monforte d'Alba. The Pecchenino vineyards of Dogliani consist of 70% Dolcetto vines and the remaining 30% split between Barbera, Nebbiolo & Chardonnay. Monforte d'Alba is one of the most prestigious areas for production of Barolo DOCG.

Tuscany - is synonymous with Chianti – the name given to the large wine producing area in Tuscany’s heart as well as the wine produced. In the past few decades an unofficial category of Tuscan wine has arisen - the “Super Tuscan”. Wines created by making unconventional blends of both indigenous & international grape varieties. Tuscany is the building block of Italy’s fine wine reputation and we need look no further than Montalcino. This region has one of the warmest and driest climates in Tuscany. With the varied soils and differing vineyard aspects, this region produces the finest expression of Sangiovese – Brunello di Montalcino.

FERRERO

Arriving in Montalcino at the beginning of the 80's, Pablo from Switzerland and Claudia from Piedmont met whilst both working for **Castello Banfi** in Montalcino. In 2009 Pablo stopped working as winemaker, choosing to dedicate his time to his family business, whilst consulting for a few other estates. Today the estate is farming roughly 14 acres of vineyards, 7.5 in Montalcino and slightly more than 6 in Montenero d'Orcia.

GUICCIARDINI STROZZI

Guicciardini Strozzi (two families united by marriage) is one of the oldest producers in Tuscany with their San Girolamo estate dating back to the 900s. They were once as influential as the Medici’s and they have embraced modern winemaking philosophies well, whilst maintaining this extraordinary heritage.

Pulia lies in the southern part of the region that forms the characteristic heel of the Italian "boot". It produces more wine than any other Italian region usually making up around 17% of the national total. The flagship red grape of Puglia is Primitivo, a distant cousin of California's Zinfandel grape. The wines made with Primitivo are luscious, heavy and definitely "food wines". Negroamaro is grown almost exclusively in Pulia and gives very rustic wines with earthy characters and nice perfumed notes.

ANTONINI CERESA

Passion and competence are the key words of this wineries production philosophy along with the endless search for the best conditions for winemaking and ageing. The vineyards lie where a thin red strip of land spreads over a cool layer of calcareous rock, which crumbles to a rich sandy soil near the coastline. The hot sunny temperature of the days is met with perfectly cooler night breezes which caress the land throughout most of the year. The natural forces and passion of the vineyard farmers cultivate and care for the one hundred year old bush-vines which in turn produce very concentrated and complex fruits.

SICILY has more vineyards than any of the other Italian regions and competes with Pulia for first place as the largest wine producer. Interestingly, Sicilians consume less wine per capita than any other Italian. Dessert wines account for about 90% of the total DOC production and in the world of international wine, Sicily is renowned for the many outstanding dessert wines, such as the world-famous Marsala. However – you should write off that remaining 10%! They make some amazing red and white wines all over the island with the most important red grape being Nero d'Avola – one of Italy's most significant indigenous variety.

TOLA

The estate's vineyards lie between Bosco Falconera and Giambosano, in turn between Palermo and Trapani where the vineyards feel the warm Sirocco winds and the light breezes coming off the sea. Vines average 25 years old, yield 2kg of grapes per vine, are espalier trained and guyot pruned.

VENETO is protected from the harsh northern European climate by the magnificent Alps. The regions cooler areas are well-suited to white varieties while the warmer Adriatic coastal plains and river valleys are where the renowned reds are produced such as Valpolicella. Prosecco is Italy's most famous sparkling wine that is produced in region. It is also the informal name for the grape variety used to make the wine, which official known as Glera. The name change came about is 2009 when the Italian government to measures to regulate and protect the 'Prosecco' name under DOC law. This means wines labeled with this name can only come from specific areas in North Eastern Italy.

LE TOBELE

Le Tobele Estate and winery is owned by the Degani family who have been making wines for over five generations. The family's passion, love and embracing of new technology creates a perfect harmony resulting in products of a very high standard and quality.

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Champagne Joseph Perrier: In 1825, the days of the stagecoach, Joseph Perrier, son of the founding father, established a Champagne House bearing his name, in Chalons-sur-Marne, today renamed Chalons-en-Champagne, a town in which he was to become the mayor. His Champagne was recognized by the worlds greatest, indeed Joseph Perrier was an appointed supplier to Queen Victoria and King Edward VII, hence the Royal Cuvees. Since that time, the House has maintained its traditional ways, which continue to be a success, managed by the same family over four generations.

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Catalonia (Catalunya) is a dynamic wine producing region located in the Mediterranean north east coast of Spain. Catalonia has been at the forefront of moves to reform Spain's wine industry through the introduction of international grape varieties and modern viticultural techniques. *Catalonia* is regarded as distinct from Spain's other wine-growing regions because of the versatility of its wine styles. There is a strong French influence especially with its most recognizable wines the Champagne-style sparkling 'Cava'. The 'Cava DO' was introduced in 1970, in a move designed both to hallmark Spain's best sparkling wines and distinguish Cava from French Champagne. In the past, most Spanish sparkling wine had been labelled as Champana, which led to an obvious conflict with French Champagne producers. The word *cava* is derived from the Latin word 'cavea' and means 'cellar' or 'cave' in Catalonia, where most Cava is made. The Catalan tradition of ageing wines in underground cellars was what led Jose Raventos, the first known producer of cava to choose this name.

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Navarra is a land rich culture and history and offers a great diversity of climate conditions. Situated in Northern Spain its vineyards (split into 5 distinct sub areas; Tierra Estella, Valdizarbe, Baja Montana, Ribera Alta and Ribera Baja) nestle in the lower slopes of the Pyrenees as they descend towards the River Ebro. Ancient Romans planted grapes as early as the 2nd Century BC, however the arrival of the Phylloxera louse in 1892 devastated almost 98% of the then very prosperous wine making region. The 20th Century saw the grafting of vines to New World root stock and with that a huge shift from high volume wines to serious wines of serious quality. There is now over 14,000 hectares under vine thanks to Navarra's variety of soil and micro climates- ideal for cultivating vineyards.

Rias Biexas is nestled along the coast of the Atlantic Ocean in the North Western part of Spain. Over 90% of the wine produced in this region is made from the single white grape variety Albarino (pronounced al-ba-ree-nyo). Originally the "DO" (Denomination of Origin) belonged to the grape itself rather than the region however this changed in 1986 when Spain joined the EU. Albarino's popularity has blossomed in recent years and the grape enjoys a cult status among Spain's wine drinking elite. There are 5 sub zones within the Rias Biexas region, each giving a particular stamp to this versatile grape. Depending on its origin of production, it is often compared to Riesling, Viognier and Pinot Grigio. It's a very malleable grape, though many producers prefer to age it in Stainless steel for early, fresh consumption.

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Ribera del Duero is an important wine producing region situated in Northern Spain. It sits on the elevated Northern plateau of the Iberian Peninsula at a height of 800 meters above sea level. It is divided by the Duero river which provides the much needed water supply. The climate sees hot dry summers and harsh winters and the growing season the warm day time temperatures followed by cool nights optimizes the accumulation of aroma and flavor in the grapes.

This is a small single Estate spanning 35 hectares of Ribera del Duero's most premium vineyard area. Known as the Golden Mile due to its amazing weather patterns (Poor sandy soils, maximum sun exposure and very little frost) it is home to some of the great Spanish wines such as Vega Sicilia. Biodynamic practices are used in the making of these hand crafted wines. They embrace the balance of modern Spanish winemaking while reflecting the classic terroir of the region.

Rioja, located in Northern Spain along the River Ebro, La Rioja benefits from a continental climate. The Cantabrian Mountains to the north help to isolate the region which has a moderating effect on the climate. They also protect the vineyards from the fierce winds that are typical of northern Spain. A distinct characteristic of Rioja wine is the effect of oak aging. First introduced in the early 18th century by Bordeaux influenced winemakers, the use of oak and the pronounced vanilla flavors in the wines has been a virtual trademark of the region.



BODEGAS NAVAJAS Bodegas Navajas is a family-run winery in the village of Navarrete, Rioja. It was founded in 1918 as Bodegas Arjona, but in 1983 the Navajas family changed its name to Bodegas Navajas and rebuilt the original winery. The Navajas family have preserved the same architectonic style for all the buildings with the goal of making Bodegas Navajas, not only a winery, but an integral part of Spain's long standing historic wine industry. 2006 saw the first release for some years of their delicious, Navajas Rosado which has been ageing in oak casks for

seven months. In addition the Crianza has a reputation for its outstanding quality after being awarded 'Best Value Red' in the 'New Wave Spanish Wine' awards in London. The judging panel was made up of 16 experts and 824 wines took part in this edition.

RAMON BILBAO

Ramón Bilbao was a forward-looking grape grower who aged his wines, one of the pioneers in the art of ageing. He founded the winery in 1924 after spending many years as a wine trader. The winery was handed down from one generation to the next until the year 1966, when Ramón Bilbao Pozo, the last of the descendants, died. In 1999 Diego Zamora, S.A., acquired the winery and began, renovating and adapting existing facilities with out deviating from its founders original philosophy that turned the men and women who worked at the bodega into true experts in the art of ageing wines.

OLD PLAINS **Practicing Sustainable viticultural techniques**

A James Halliday 4 star winery owned by Tim Freeland and Dominic Torzi (of Torzi Matthews's fame). Their vineyard is very special due to the small parcels of Grenache, Shiraz and Cabernet Sauvignon vines it has. The wines are consistently high quality and great value for money.

SMALL FRY **Certified Organic**

In a world where *everyone* is boasting a natural, hands on, traditional winemaking – it is hard to be taken seriously when you are the genuine article. But call it what you want. When you open a bottle you will understand. Small Fry's minimal intervention approach allows the wines to speak for themselves. The biggest point of difference between them and the majority of the Barossa winemaking community is that they rely on wild yeast to conduct the primary alcoholic ferment. In addition to that owner and wine maker, Wayne Ahrens has been known to climb into the fermenter in bare feet – all in the name of making the best wines possible.

Peter Clarke is the name behind Tin Shed. A rather unpretentious name that reflects the down to earth warm man behind the wine. Not only is he a classy wine maker he is a wonderful chef and host at his Barossa restaurant – Vintners Bar & Grill. We all know that MSG is bad for us, but not this one – Mourvedre, Shiraz, Grenache – a different twist on the usually GSM blend. It displays a deep flavoured brooding slightly earthy, but nicely rich wine.

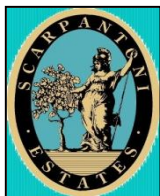
KOONARA Organic conversion in process

1906, Henry Albert and Alice Jane Reschke came to Coonawarra to build a life for their family. Nearly 100 years on, the family still live in Coonawarra. The Cattle stud on the property is still here, but the vineyards and wine have been the family focus and passion since 1988. Every year since 1991, Koonara has been made for family and friends. Finally in 1999, they decided to make the wine available for the public. Small batches of wines are crafted, then and held back to give further bottle maturity.

The Scarpantoni brothers built their winery from the labours of their 79 year old father, who emigrated from Abruzzi (Italy) at age 19. He was one of the region's largest grape growers in the 60's & 70's and settled in McLaren Vale due to the consistency and reliability of the harvests. **Brothers Block Cabernet Sauv '06 was awarded the prestigious Jimmy Watson Award & the Block 3 Shiraz '06 won the Great Australia Shiraz Challenge.**

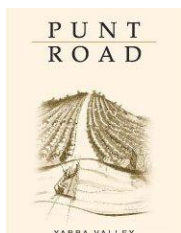

VIOGNIER – to try or not to try? Thanks to the popularity of Rhone Valley white Condrieu in the early 1900's Viognier became a very fashionable grape. Viognier's appeal has slowly infiltrated other countries with a few outstanding wines being found in South Australia and parts of New Zealand. Unlike the heady, acidic Northern Rhone counterpart, Viognier from South Australia takes on a completely different character. Willunga 100 Viognier comes from a selection of vineyards – some with over 50 year old vines. The cool climate fruit has tempered the McLaren Vale component adding some elegance and citrus notes to the traditional rich round apricot and stone fruit kernel notes often seen in the warmer viticultural districts. For those who would like something new – this is the perfect wine to try.

Yarra Valley is one of Australia's leading regions for producing cool climate wines and is Victoria's oldest wine producing region. The climate is cool in relation to the rest of Australia's other viticultural regions – and to put in perspective, is cooler than Bordeaux but warmer than Burgundy. Resulting wines are elegant, refined and delicious.

PUNT ROAD



Punt Road winery is located on St. Huberts Road in Coldstream – the heart of the Yarra Valley. Their wine maker, Kate Goodman has worked for some of the great names in Australia and has managed vintages in Champagne and California. In 2005 she traveled to Spain to work with leading wine maker, Telmo Rodriguez. She believes the satisfaction and rewards for producing quality wines are endless.

A unique feature of the region is the soils which have developed on ancient Cambrian rocks. In fact Heathcote sits on a geological fault line and there are many different soil types originating from a complex local geology.

RED EDGE



‘Red Edge’ is a play on owner, Peter Dredge’s last name. He bought the vineyard in 1994 – though plantings date back to 1971, which for Heathcote is about as old as it gets. Yields are low, at around 15 hl/ha, and fermentation is with indigenous yeasts. The wines are aged in a mix of old & new French oak.

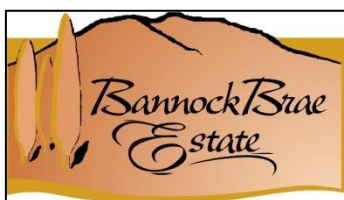
TRENTHAM ESTATE

Maipo, Chile is the country's oldest and most famous growing area. It's a sub region within the larger Central Valley region and lies just south of Santiago, Chile's capital city. Ocean breezes and elevation provide a number of cool growing areas within the region making it possible to grow white as well as red grapes.

The Cabernet comes from vineyards in Peumo and Cornellena, the fruit is very ripe and the wine is handled carefully to ensure it does not become too robust and remains supple and approachable. Grapes are destalked to avoid excessive tannins, skins are plunged gently in the fermentation to extract good colour without extracting too many tannins.

The vineyards lie along the banks of the Cachapual River in the Rapel Valley. The vineyards 1,500 planted acres are spread out in three smaller valleys known as Peumo, Cornellana and La Palmeria de Cocalan, each known for its individual characteristics - the Peumo plantation contains the oldest vines in the estate, Cornellana has steeply sloping vineyards within a narrow and hidden valley and La Palmeria de Cocalan is where the vineyards share the fields with hundreds of ancient native Chilean palm trees.

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Mendoza, Argentina - is the heart and soul of the Argentine wine industry. There were significant turning points in the industry over the years. Around 80% of the countries plantings are Malbec that have been planted with French root stock.

Made by the Barberis Family, located in Vistalba in the region of Lujan in Mendoza. For a long time, the family was growers of grapes and sold them to other producers. In 1965 they set up their first winery, which was expanded and improved in 1989. The children of the founder, Don Humberto Barberis are now all actively involved in the running of the business.

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Constantia is the oldest wine-making region in the southern hemisphere, dating back to 1685. The beautiful Valley takes its name from the farm granted to Simon van de Stel in 1685 by Commissioner van Rheeede. It is said that Governor van der Stel named his property after Constanza, the little daughter of his benefactor. Today, it is the Cape's most intimate wine route consisting of nine wine farms each with their own distinctive heritage and premium wines.

EAGLES NEST

Eagles' Nest, cradled in the breathtakingly beautiful Constantia Valley, was originally a section of Groote Constantia, the wine supplier to European nobility, established by Simon van der Stel in the late 1600's. History reveals that it is operated as a commercial farm producing fruit up until the 1960's. In 1984 the Mylrea family took over. While Constantia Valley is most famous for white, the terroir at Eagles nest is more suited to red. The farm's objective is to produce wines that are quality driven, consistent and reflect the unique terroir of the region. In addition, the reds are aged for 18 months in barrel and then further bottle aged for 12 to 18 months before being released.
