N.E.W. Master Gardeners' Plant Sale – "From Our Gardens to Yours"

May 25 & 26, 2018

Directions for Donating Plants: It is necessary for the Plant Sale Committee to get information on the plants you are donating ahead of time so we have enough time to prepare plant labels. Following these directions will make it possible for the Plant Sale Committee to match your donated plants with prepared labels.

The Basics:

- Decide which and how many of each plant you <u>might</u> dig up. (If you don't end up digging it, that's OK.).
- Email or call <u>Jill Miller</u> at <u>icidmiller@gmail.com</u> or 920-621-4778 with information about the plants you plan to donate.
 - **1.** Common name of the plant
 - 2. If known, the cultivar name (e.g. 'Northern Gold' Forsythia). If you don't know the cultivar name, give a description of the plant (e.g. purple/lavender iris, height, light/moisture requirements, pH requirement, etc.).
 - **3.** How many plants?
 - **4.** If you wish, you can include a comment/tip about the plant (e.g. "prune to the ground in spring")
- You will receive an email or phone call back from Jill Miller with unique numbers for you to label your donated plants. (For example: Peach colored daylily = 23, Snowberry = 24, 'Northern Sun' Forsythia = 25). When you dig up the plants, write the unique number for each plant variety on a piece of tape, popsicle stick, etc. and attach to/stick in the pot.

The Details:

- If possible, use one-gallon pots. If you need pots, contact Plant Sale team member, Rob Dreher at 920-339-3247 or rdreher624@gmail.com.
- Make the plants ready for sale (in a clean pot and nicely filled with light compost). If you have any concerns of jumping worms in your garden, wash all garden soil from the plants roots and use purchased planting medium to repot the plants.
- Drop off your donated plants with each one labeled with the unique variety number provided to you by Jill Miller.
- You can drop off your plants:
 - 1. At the Extension greenhouse (1150 Bellevue Street) from 5:00 to 7:00 pm on Wednesday, May 23 or
 - **2.** At the Neville Museum (210 Museum Place use Extension door at northwest corner of building) from 10:00 am to 4:30 pm on Thursday, May 24
