## Praying With Persistence

**Luke 18:1-8 (NLT)** <sup>1</sup> One day Jesus told his disciples a story to show that they should always pray and never give up. <sup>2</sup> “There was a judge in a certain city,” he said, “who neither feared God nor cared about people. <sup>3</sup> A widow of that city came to him repeatedly, saying, ‘Give me justice in this dispute with my enemy.’ <sup>4</sup> The judge ignored her for a while, but finally he said to himself, ‘I don’t fear God or care about people, <sup>5</sup> but this woman is driving me crazy. I’m going to see that she gets justice, because she is wearing me out with her constant requests!’” <sup>6</sup> Then the Lord said, “Learn a lesson from this unjust judge. <sup>7</sup> Even he rendered a just decision in the end. So don’t you think God will surely give justice to his chosen people who cry out to him day and night? Will he keep putting them off? <sup>8</sup> I tell you, he will grant justice to them quickly! But when the Son of Man returns, how many will he find on the earth who have faith?”

**1 Sam 24:4-12 (NLT)** <sup>4</sup> “Now’s your opportunity!” David’s men whispered to him. “Today the LORD is telling you, ‘I will certainly put your enemy into your power, to do with as you wish.’” So David crept forward and cut off a piece of the hem of Saul’s robe. <sup>5</sup> But then David’s conscience began bothering him because he had cut Saul’s robe. <sup>6</sup> “The LORD knows I shouldn’t have done that to my lord the king,” he said to his men. “The LORD forbid that I should do this to my lord the king and attack the LORD’s anointed one, for the LORD himself has chosen him.” <sup>7</sup> So David restrained his men and did not let them kill Saul. After Saul had left the cave and gone on his way, <sup>8</sup> David came out and shouted after him, “My lord the king!” And when Saul looked around, David bowed low before him. <sup>9</sup> Then he shouted to Saul, “Why do you listen to the people who say I am trying to harm you? <sup>10</sup> This very day you can see with your own eyes it isn’t true. For the LORD placed you at my mercy back there in the cave. Some of my men told me to kill you, but I spared you. For I said, ‘I will never harm the king—he is the LORD’s anointed one.’ <sup>11</sup> Look, my father, at what I have in my hand. It is a piece of the hem of your robe! I cut it off, but I didn’t kill you. This proves that I am not trying to harm you and that I have not sinned against you, even though you have been hunting for me to kill me. <sup>12</sup> “May the LORD judge between us. Perhaps the LORD will punish you for what you are trying to do to me, but I will never harm you.”
