# Teaching Outline

## Psalm 119 Week 11

### Psalms 119:97 (NLT)

<sup>97</sup> Oh, how I love your instructions! I think about them all day long.

**1 Cor 2:7-16 (NLT)** <sup>7</sup> No, the wisdom we speak of is the mystery of God —his plan that was previously hidden, even though he made it for our ultimate glory before the world began.

<sup>8</sup> But the rulers of this world have not understood it; if they had, they would not have crucified our glorious Lord.<sup>9</sup> That is what the Scriptures mean when they say, “No eye has seen, no ear has heard, and no mind has imagined what God has prepared for those who love him.”

<sup>10</sup> But it was to us that God revealed these things by his Spirit. For his Spirit searches out everything and shows us God’s deep secrets.<sup>11</sup> No one can know a person’s thoughts except that person’s own spirit, and no one can know God’s thoughts except God’s own Spirit.<sup>12</sup> And we have received God’s Spirit (not the world’s spirit), so we can know the wonderful things God has freely given us.<sup>13</sup> When we tell you these things, we do not use words that come from human wisdom. Instead, we speak words given to us by the Spirit, using the Spirit’s words to explain spiritual truths. <sup>14</sup> But people who aren’t spiritual can’t receive these truths from God’s Spirit. It all sounds foolish to them and they can’t understand it, for only those who are spiritual can understand what the Spirit means.<sup>15</sup> Those who are spiritual can evaluate all things, but they themselves cannot be evaluated by others.<sup>16</sup> For, “Who can know the LORD’s thoughts? Who knows enough to teach him?” But we understand these things, for we have the mind of Christ.

### Psalms 119:98-104 (NLT)

<sup>98</sup> Your commands make me wiser than my enemies, for they are my constant guide.<sup>99</sup> Yes, I have more insight than my teachers, for I am always thinking of your laws.<sup>100</sup> I am even wiser than my elders, for I have kept your commandments.<sup>101</sup> I have refused to walk on any evil path, so that I may remain obedient to your word.<sup>102</sup> I haven’t turned away from your regulations, for you have taught me well. <sup>103</sup> How sweet your words taste to me; they are sweeter than honey.<sup>104</sup> Your commandments give me understanding; no wonder I hate every false way of life.

**Phil 2:3-8 (NLT)** <sup>3</sup> Don’t be selfish; don’t try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves.<sup>4</sup> Don’t look out only for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too.<sup>5</sup> You must have the same attitude that Christ Jesus had. <sup>6</sup> Though he was God, he did not think of equality with God as something to cling to.<sup>7</sup> Instead, he gave up his divine privileges ; he took the humble position of a slave and was born as a human being. When he appeared in human form, <sup>8</sup> he humbled himself in obedience to God and died a criminal’s death on a cross.
