MUSIC DEGREES AT FLORIDA COLLEGE

Florida College is approved by the National Association of Schools of Music and by the Southern Association of College and Schools to offer the Bachelor of Arts in Music and the Bachelor of Science in Music Education.

The Bachelor of Arts in Music is a liberal arts degree that allows students to study a broad music curriculum while also having extensive opportunities to improve performance skills. In addition to the general education core and required Bible classes, students study music theory, music history, music technology, conducting and take private lessons on a principal instrument or voice culminating in a senior recital. They participate in ensembles and usually also take piano and voice classes or lessons if those are not their principal instrument.

The Bachelor of Science in Music Education is approved by the state of Florida and prepares students to meet state certification requirements for teaching music at all levels in schools. In addition to the general education core, required Bible classes, and music classes taken by students in the BA in Music, students in Music Education also take professional education and music education courses that include pre-internship field experiences and a semester-long internship. Graduation requirements include passing scores on three Florida Teacher Certification Exams: The General Knowledge Test, the Professional Education Exam, and the Music K-12 Subject Area Exam.
