Infinite Scholars Sponsorship Proposal

Statement of Need

The Education Element, Inc. is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization in the State of Georgia. We offer Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics programs to underrepresented minority youth throughout the Metro Atlanta area. Our focus is on quality, not quantity. The programs we offer go beyond just a simple experiment; we make tremendous effort to ensure that scholars truly understand the basics.

Our programs are designed by students that have continuously demonstrated academic excellence. The Board of Directors for The Education Element have experience with: The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), Louis Stokes Alliance for Minority Participation (LSAMP), The University of Georgia College of Engineering and Clark Atlanta's Computational Chemistry Department.

According to the Education Trust, for every 100 African American kindergarteners, only 88 will graduate from high school and only 16 of that 88 will finish college. As discouraging, as these projections are, an even smaller fraction of minority high school graduates possess the academic skills needed for careers in science and engineering.

Only 1 in 100 African American seventeen year olds can comfortably solve multistep mathematic equations or do elementary algebra, compared with 1 in 10 Caucasian high school graduates. Beginning in 2012–2013, the Georgia Department of Education required all elementary and middle schools to make science their Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) second indicator.

The State's rationale for this strategy is two-fold:

(1) student interest in and preparation for science in high school must begin at the elementary school level.

(2) requiring student achievement in science when determining whether schools make AYP will help ensure an instructional focus on teaching and learning. Mastery of mathematics, science, and technology is no longer only for future scientists and engineers; it is essential preparation for all students. Despite an overall increase in postsecondary education enrollment for over a

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decade, the percentage of STEM college graduates has declined. While the proportion of K–12 students who achieve at the proficient level or above on the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) mathematics exam is increasing, achievement gaps between whites and minorities remain.

Scientists, educators, and government experts agree there is a general lack of public understanding of science. Educators and employers are worried that too few Americans have functional literacy in math, science, technology, and engineering. In a recent poll, just 26% of Americans believe they have a good understanding of science fully and 44% could not identify a single scientist, living or dead, whom they would consider a role model for the nation's young people.

On a recent round of international tests, U.S. students rated below average in math and science literacy. Not only do fewer of our students understand the intricacies of science and math, but also very few of America's youth are preparing for careers in math and science.

In 2009, the reading achievement gap between eighth-grade students in low-poverty versus high poverty schools was 34 points on a 500-point scale, and the mathematics achievement gap was 38 points.

Program Backgound

The Infinite Scholars Summer Math Camp will expose students to the fundamentals of next level mathematics and coding. Emphasis will be placed on pre-algebra, algebra and object oriented programming. Scholars in this program are given the opportunity, to broaden their perspective and explore the opportunities of computer scientist and mathematician. Although our goal is to encourage careers in STEM, Infinite Scholars Math is open to all students that are hungry for knowledge and understanding. Our program is unique because we serve minority students from all over Atlanta, on Atlanta Metropolitan State College's campus for 7 weeks. This design promotes networking, exposure to college facilities, and a return on investment on



Education. Infinite Scholars Summer Math Camp will prepare students for advance placement opportunities by such as: dual enrollment, Talented and Gifted (TAG) program and Beta Club. Overall we hope to increase student's appreciation and understanding of the world around them.
