August 1, 2017

10am-12pm or 6pm-8pm

Orientation to Outdoor Digital Photography Class

This is a two-hour (with additional live shoot time) course for beginning outdoor digital photography that is conducted in the classroom with a shoot component. Students are taught how to get started, including types of cameras; camera equipment; using a digital camera; what do all those settings and terms mean; basic composition; creative photography; and basic image editing. These classes are designed for those that have used digital cameras very little or not at all and want to become more comfortable with their use and improve your photo quality.

August 2, 2017

9am-12pm or 6pm-9pm

Orientation to Fly Fishing

This is a three-hour (with additional live practice time) course for fly fishing that is conducted in the classroom with a live practice component. Students are taught the safety aspects of fly fishing; gear for fly fishing; uses of gear; fly types; fly uses; casting; and where to go for fly fishing.

August 7, 2017

9am-12pm or 6pm-9pm

Orientation to Handguns I

This is a three-hour course for safe handgun handling and shooting that is conducted in the classroom. Students are taught the rules for safe gun handling; primary causes of handgun accidents; handgun parts; how to safely unload certain action types; ammunition components and types; and safe storage options of handguns in the home and elsewhere.

OR

NRA Basics of Pistol Shooting Part 1

Course topics include: gun safety rules, proper operation of revolvers and semi-automatic pistols, ammunition knowledge and selection, and pistol selection and storage. Students will receive the NRA Guide: Basics of Pistol Shooting handbook, take a Basics of Pistol Shooting Student Examination and receive a course completion certificate bearing the signature of the NRA Secretary and your NRA Certified Instructor after completing both Part 1 and Part 2.

August 8, 2017

9am-12pm or 6pm-9pm

Orientation to Handguns II

This is a three-hour (with additional live fire time) course for safe handgun handling and shooting that is conducted in the classroom with a shooting component. Students are taught the rules for safe gun handling; how to safely unload certain action types; basic cleaning and care; range protocol; application of pistol shooting fundamentals; stable shooting positions and presentation; basic principles of concealed carry; and live fire.

OR

NRA Basic Pistol Shooting Part 2

Course topics include: shooting fundamentals, pistol inspection and maintenance, marksmanship, and shooting range safety. Additionally, students will complete live fire training and a nationally standardized shooting qualification while on the range with an NRA Certified Instructor. Students will receive the NRA Guide: Basics of Pistol Shooting handbook, take a Basics of Pistol Shooting Student Examination and receive a course completion certificate bearing the signature of the NRA Secretary and your NRA Certified Instructor after completing both Part 1 and Part 2.

August 9 & 10, 2017

8am-12:30pm or 5:30pm-10pm

NC Concealed Carry Handgun Permit Class

This class will meet the NC DOJ requirements for students to apply to their local sheriff's department for their NC Concealed Handgun Permit. It will include 8 hours of classroom instruction plus legal exam and handgun shooting qualification. The shooting qualification portion will be held after the classroom portion is concluded or by appointment within seven (7) days of the last day of class.

August 11, 2017

9am-12pm or 6pm-9pm

Basic Emergency Preparedness I

This is a three-hour course for basic disaster preparedness that will cover subjects such as your first move in emergency or disaster preparation, tools and equipment, your plan, sheltering and defense in different locations, water storage and disinfection, food, energy, hygiene and first aid, communication and special considerations.

NC Concealed Carry Handgun Permit Class

This class will meet the NC DOJ requirements for students to apply to their local sheriff's department for their NC Concealed Handgun Permit. It will include 8 hours of classroom instruction plus legal exam and handgun shooting qualification. The shooting qualification portion will be held after the classroom portion is concluded or by appointment within seven (7) days of the last day of class.

August 14, 2017

9am-12pm or 6pm-9pm

Orientation to Shotguns I

This is a three-hour course for safe shotgun handling and shooting that is conducted in the classroom with a shooting component. Students are taught the rules for safe gun handling; primary causes of shotgun accidents; shotgun parts; how to safely unload certain action types; ammunition components and types; basic cleaning and care; and safe storage options of shotguns in the home.

OR

NRA Basic Shotgun Shooting Part 1

This course is at least ten-hours long and includes classroom and range time learning how to shoot shotguns at moving targets. Students learn NRA's rules for safe gun handling; shotgun parts and operation; shotgun shell components; shotgun shell malfunctions. Students will receive the Basics of Shotgun Shooting handbook, NRA Gun Safety Rules brochure, Winchester/NRA Marksmanship Qualification booklet, take a Basics of Shotgun Shooting Student Examination, and receive a course completion certificate once all portions are successfully completed.

August 15, 2017

6pm-9pm

Orientation to Shotguns II

This is a three-hour course for safe shotgun handling and shooting that is conducted in the classroom with a shooting component. Students are taught the rules for safe gun handling; primary causes of shotgun accidents; shotgun parts; how to safely unload certain action types; ammunition components and types; basic cleaning and care; and safe storage options of shotguns in the home.

OR

NRA Basic Shotgun Shooting Part 2

This course is at least ten-hours long and includes classroom and range time learning how to shoot shotguns at moving targets. Students learn shooting fundamentals; range rules; shooting at straight away and angled targets; cleaning; and continued opportunities for skill development. Students will receive the Basics of Shotgun Shooting handbook, NRA Gun Safety Rules brochure, Winchester/NRA Marksmanship Qualification booklet, take a Basics of Shotgun Shooting Student Examination, and receive a course completion certificate once all portions are successfully completed. **8:30am-6:30pm**

August 16, 2017

Orientation to Clay Shooting

This is a three-hour course for beginning clay shooters that is conducted in the classroom only. Students are taught how to get started, including types of clay shooting; common equipment for different types of clay shooting; use and purpose of common equipment; shooting etiquette; how to get more involved; and where to participate.

August 17, 2017

9am-12pm

Home Firearm Safety Class

This is a three-hour course for safe gun handling that is conducted in the classroom only. Students are taught the rules for safe gun handling; primary causes of firearms accidents; firearm parts; how to unload certain action types; ammunition components; cleaning; care; safe storage of firearms in the home; and the benefits of becoming an active participant in the shooting sports.

This class will meet the NC DOJ requirements for students to apply to their local sheriff's department for their NC Concealed Handgun Permit. It will include 8 hours of classroom instruction plus legal exam and handgun shooting qualification. The shooting qualification portion will be held after the classroom portion is concluded.

August 24, 2017

9am-12pm or 6pm-9pm

Orientation to Rifle Shooting

This is a three-hour (with additional live fire time) course for safe rifle handling and shooting that is conducted in the classroom with a shooting component. Students are taught the rules for safe gun handling; primary causes of rifle accidents; rifle parts; how to safely unload certain action types; ammunition components and types; basic cleaning and care; and safe storage options of rifles in the home. These classes are designed for those that have handled rifles very little or not at all and want to become more comfortable around them at home or in your environment.

Clays Under the Lights Outing

Grab your shotgun and a girlfriend to join us for dinner and a night of clays under the lights at Triggers, Traps and Trout. The night off will start with dinner on our way to Burnsville.
