PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION PROCESS

Steps to become President of the United States:

Step 1 (Primaries & Caucuses) & Step 2 (National Convention) are listed in the RRWF March Newsletter.

Step 3: General Election

The presidential candidates participate in debates and general election campaigns throughout the country to explain their views and plans in order to win the support of potential voters. Before the November election, political parties in each state create lists of potential electors (generally active members of the party) who pledge to vote for the party's candidate in the Electoral College. On Election Day, November 7, polling booths will open in all 50 states and in Washington D.C. and around 100 million votes are expected to be cast.

Step 4: Electoral College

The 12th Amendment to the United States Constitution outlines the process for electing the President of the United States. The indirect method of popular election is known as the Electoral College. The "Electoral College" is the unofficial term coined in the 1800s for the group of citizens selected by the people to cast votes for President and Vice President.

The winner of the popular vote in each state receives all (some exceptions) of the state's number of Electoral College votes. In the end, the winner of the race is the candidate who receives a majority (270) of the 538 Electoral College votes. Each state's block of electors assembles in their respective state capital in December. At the meeting, the electors sign the "Certificate of Vote" which is sealed and delivered to the Office of the President of the U. S. Senate. A special joint session of the U.S. Congress convenes in January, 2017. At this meeting, the President of the Senate reads the Certificates of Votes and declares the official winner.

It is possible for a candidate to receive the majority of the popular vote but not of the electoral vote and lose a presidential election.

There is a possibility – as happened in 2000 – that at the end of Election Day we may still not know who's won. The result could either be too close to call without counting every vote or else legal battles over election procedures may delay the result or force a recount. It could even be a tie, with both candidates stuck at 269, in which case the House of Representatives would vote to choose the next president.



MAY SPEAKER BIOS

Vivian Moreno is a Riverside citizen who self appointed herself as an auditor of the City of Riverside. According to Vivian, the effort uncovered a rash of suspect transactions. In 2012, she sued the city over its transfer of water utility funds into the general fund. In a settlement, the city agreed to let voters decide whether to continue the transfer. Moreno says if elected she would be a watchdog by reading documents on proposed projects and spending. Moreno has criticized Mayor Bailey's plan to build a streetcar line. In 1994, Vivian and her husband, Javier, founded Biokorium Skin Care

Paul Davis served Riverside as a Riverside County Deputy Sheriff and later as a Riverside Police Officer. He left the Department to accept a position in finance and banking. During his 14-year career in the field, he managed multiple state and international operations and regularly oversaw hundreds of employees, with budgets exceeding nearly \$100 million. A passionate advocate for transparency, Paul devoted himself to lobbying state and federal government for better oversight and disclosure laws in his own leasing industry.

Paul was elected to the city council in 2009. Paul and his wife, May, own two local businesses and are raising two sons.
